



parative religions in college that I realized Jesus was not actually a "four-letter word." How embarrassing! So what do most Jewish people know about Jesus? Most likely, we know that he was born Jewish and that he lived what we would see today as a Jewishly observant life. However, from the informal poll I've taken, that's about it.

Who was Jesus of Nazareth? What did he believe? What did he teach his followers? Did he intend to start a new religion? What might he think of Christianity today? These are just a few of the questions that we will be discussing in a two-part Lunchtime Learning class that I will be teaching in March. # FROM RABBI BERGMAN CHARITY FOR THOSE WHO SEEM TO NEED IT LEAST

There is an interesting discussion in the Talmud about the obligation of the community to support someone who had once been well off, but was now impoverished. One opinion is that circumstance should not matter and that everyone should receive

the same assistance. The community would set a certain amount for each person, whether that person was always poor or had suddenly lost everything. There are no gray areas to this approach. This seems to be the fairest way of dealing with these situations.

There is another opinion, though, that says a person should be sustained in the way they were used to living, at least until they can adjust to their loss of comfort and status. On the surface this seems ridiculously unfair. Why should a formerly wealthy person who lived on delicacies his or her whole life still get them when someone poor, who never had these things, still gets none?

The Talmud, however, is not just interested in people's physical well-being, but in their emotional health, as well. People used to certain luxuries may never adjust to their new

# IN OUR BETH ACHIM RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

The Torah has us celebrate Rosh Hashanah in the seventh month and Pesach in the first. This tells us that Purim is at the end of the holiday cycle, and how appropriate! We've made it out of Egypt, received the Ten Commandments, wandered in the desert, and fought our enemies. Purim is the time to celebrate our victory and the sense that we know how to take care of ourselves. It is a time to take a deep breath and have a laugh at ourselves, a time that we finally understand what we are about. By Purim we have learned how to be a community that cares for one another. So, please join us as we celebrate on Sunday, March 4 with SHUSHAN IDOL followed by an amazing carnival.

During February we collected Tzedakah to be donated to "PURIM FOR IDF SOLDIERS." Our B'nai Mitzvah seventh graders will be packing Mishloach Manot plates and delivering them to JARC homes. Each of our classes will be discussing Purim from a different age appropriate viewpoint. Purim is the story of God saving the Jewish people, the story of a young woman who risks her life to help her people, the story of an influential Jew in the court of a foreign ruler, the story of the right to defend oneself, the story of a holiday that must be celebrated in community...different themes for different ages.

By attending a Megillah reading, creating Mishloach Manot (the sending of portions) giving Tzedakah (Matanot L'evyonim or gifts to the poor) and having a special festival meal, you will have completed the four mitzvot of Purim. Many people eat kreplach to reflect the tradition of eating foods with something hidden, as Esther hid her Jewishness in the palace and God's presence was hidden (not mentioned) in the Purim story. What 'hidden food' does your family like – perhaps ravioli? knishes? pita wraps? Add your own family twist to Purim and have fun!



lives if they are deprived of everything they had all at once. They may never recover from the shock of a sudden loss of status. You might argue that life is tough, and they should just deal with it. Ask yourself, though, if you were to lose your home and your job, what would you hope the community would do? What would you need to recover from such a devastating loss? How would you feel if other people were determining for you what a subsistence living was?

A lot of people in our area are dealing with these questions. Many more of us will be soon. The way our communities respond to these challenges will largely determine the future of Southeastern Michigan, if not the whole state. I am not advocating for any one position, but I think we have to consider this issue in a deep and nuanced manner, and not just react emotionally.

There are excellent arguments not to help people who have brought their problems upon themselves, except minimally. For example, if someone lost their house because they bought a sub prime mortgage, we could just say they were greedy. Unfortunately, neighborhood after neighborhood are becoming unstable, with a large number of people leaving our state for better situations. How many more can we afford to lose? We should be helping everyone hold onto their homes, no matter the reason for their difficulties.

I am not advocating a free ride for those people we may judge as irresponsible, but a way for people to get back on their feet with some dignity. It is reasonable to make some conditions for this help, such as time limits for straightening out their finances to requiring increased charitable donations when they are able to do so. This of course should not replace the help we must give to those who have been suffering for years. We have to find ways for everybody to make it in this economy, or we are all in trouble.

The Hebrew word for charity, tzedakah, really means righteousness, doing the right thing, even if we do not want to. It may seem strange to help people who already have had so much, but I think it is worth contemplating. All of us may wind up kinder and more understanding of

lives if they are deprived of everything they had all at once. They may never recover from the shock of a sudden loss of status. You might argue that life is tough, and they should just deal with it. Ask yourself, though, if you were to lose your home and your job, what would you hope the community would do? What would you need to recover from such a devastating loss? How would you feel if other people were determining for you what a subsistence living was?

A lot of people in our area are dealing with these questions. Many more of us will be soon. The way our communities respond to these challenges will largely determine the future of Southeastern Michigan, if not the whole state. I am not advocating for any one position, but I think we have to consider this issue in a deep and nuanced manner, and not just react emotionally.

There are excellent arguments not to help people who have brought their problems upon themselves, except minimally. For example, if someone lost their house because they bought a sub prime mortgage, we could just say they were greedy. Unfortunately, neighborhood after neighborhood are becoming unstable, with a large number of people leaving our state for better situations. How many more can we afford to lose? We should be helping everyone hold onto their homes, no matter the reason for their difficulties.

I am not advocating a free ride for those people we may judge as irresponsible, but a way for people to get back on their feet with some dignity. It is reasonable to make some conditions for this help, such as time limits for straightening out their finances to requiring increased charitable donations when they are able to do so. This of course should not replace the help we must give to those who have been suffering for years. We have to find ways for everybody to make it in this economy, or we are all in trouble.

The Hebrew word for charity, tzedakah, really means righteousness, doing the right thing, even if we do not want to. It may seem strange to help people who already have had so much, but I think it is worth contemplating. All of us may wind up kinder and more understanding of


