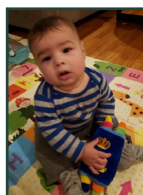

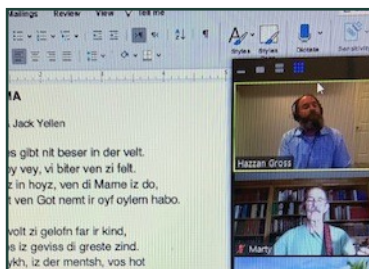



## FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOAN CHERNOFF EPSTEIN

The month of October is nearly here. I can't believe that it's fall, too. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur have been celebrated and we begin Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah.

Sukkot lasts for seven days, Shemini Atzeret is the eighth day of gathering. The number eight has special significance for me. It is the sign of infinity. The number curves and overlaps which is similar to our lives. Our lives intertwine, they begin and end. Our holidays help us to remember and reflect, looking back on the past continuing to the present and on to the future. The number eight reminds me of my family and has always been an important symbol. Simply stated, I'm fortunate to have the most important people still with me. I have my parents, children, and grandchildren.

Sadly, on the eighth day of Sukkot our family experienced the loss of my father-in-law. This happened two years ago on Shemini Atzeret when Abe passed away at 101. He had a good long life. October is still a joyful month for me. My mom will turn 91, my son Jonathan 32, and my granddaughter 3.

The number eight is quite remarkable to me. I think about how like life, it goes up and down and overlaps. Like the continuity that joins our lives to our grandparents, parents, children and grandchildren, life keeps going on and on as we celebrate these holidays, and we realize how our history continues.

The number eight gives me a vision of connection. I see our lives as two circles continuing to overlap, in this congregation, many of us used to have our parents sitting next to us, as some still do, but now we have children and our grandchildren too. With the number eight, life goes on and on and everything continues. The family of Adat Shalom must continue to look to the future as we remember the past.

A personal story that I shared with you, is to me, worth repeating. A few weeks ago in my President's message, I mentioned the story of the drive that took me from Michigan through Ohio and then Pennsylvania until our destination of Connecticut. On the drive through Pennsylvania, the roads were hilly and curving, a white knuckle drive. Suddenly, in front of me was a mountain. I was not certain if the road led through the mountain, under the mountain or over it. Obviously, there was some way I was going to get past this mountain. As we live through these challenging times, we can hope that we will find a way to continue on the road and past the mountain. Like life, we have many turns, ups and downs, but we keep going like the number 8. We make it through the challenging times and we know that we will find a way to get around through the mountain.

In closing, my sincere thanks to Rabbi Bergman, Hazzan Gross, and Michael Wolf for their outstanding handling of the High Holy Days on Zoom. Thank you to Alan Yost, who puts his heart and soul into the well-being of Adat Shalom, Susie Steinberg, Melissa Ser, Jodi Gross, and Sammi Shapiro for their dedication and commitment to our continuous education and communication, and the staff who truly are wonderful. LASTLY, my thanks to everyone who participated and brought life into the Holy Days services.



## FROM RABBI AARON BERGMAN

The Hebrew word *Simcha* means happiness, but not because of what happens in our lives, but also sometimes despite what is happening. It is a word that reminds us of our capacity for finding joy and meaning in life, no matter what else might be happening.

We might be struggling through challenges, we might be feeling loss or sorrow or pain. All of these feelings are real and valid. Judaism, though, tells us that we are more than the sum of our difficulties and suffering. By remembering our essential humanity and goodness we can still find ways to rejoice.

This is why Sukkot is called *Zman Simchateinu*, the time of our happiness. This is not a command to be happy. It is impossible to command emotions. Rather, it is a reminder that our capacity for joy is already within. In some ways, the fall is a hard time to have a holiday about being happy. It is getting darker and colder outside. The days are getting shorter. The leaves are falling.

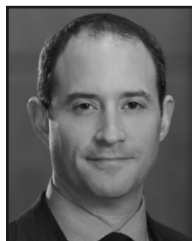
The circumstances of this year make things even more difficult than ever in every aspect of our lives, whether it involves work, school, isolation, politics, anxiety or fear, the list of what is keeping us from feeling joy seems endless.

There is a law of Sukkot that if your sukkah falls apart during the holiday you can put it back up. There is no blame or criticism or self criticism for why the sukkah may have collapsed. You just put it back up with whatever parts you have, in whatever way you can, and then take satisfaction that you are doing the best you can, and that your best is enough and worth celebrating.

Each year we build a new sukkah. Even if we use the materials from previous years, the way we arrange them or re-purpose them, or even just see them through fresh eyes makes a difference and gives us a new perspective on the possibilities of rebuilding our lives.

This is precisely why Sukkot is more important than ever. Sukkot is a reminder that life is always fragile and impermanent. That is why every moment is precious and infinitely valuable. Sukkot tells us that life is beautiful even when it is not what we thought it would be.

The holiday of Sukkot tells us just to sit and appreciate who we are right now in this moment, even if we feel we do not know what we are doing, even when we feel we cannot fix everything for our loved ones in the way we would wish. We can never make our lives perfect. Even when this horrible pandemic is over, life will still have its challenges, and we will do our best, knowing that we will make mistakes along the way. We will persevere. We will endure. That is reason enough to rejoice. May all of our days be *Zman Simchateinu*, the time of our happiness.



## FROM HAZZAN DANIEL GROSS **A SHELTER OF PEACE**

Within Maariv, the evening service, there is a beautiful prayer which is referred to by its first word, *Hashkiveinu*. Meaning "lay us down," this prayer is said at night prior to going to sleep. It is very relevant at this time because of its connection to both Sukkot and the COVID-

19 pandemic.

The second verse of the prayer asks God to protect us by spreading over us a *sukkat shelomecha*, "a shelter of Your peace." The sukkah that we build on Sukkot is a temporary dwelling where we gather with loved ones. It provides a place to commune with nature and to be amidst the peaceful beauty which surrounds us.

On Sukkot, we traditionally invite special guests to our Sukkah. Even this year, when we can't really have guests over, *these* special guests can join us. They are called *Ushpizin*, which is Aramaic for *guests*, and they are invited symbolically in order to make sure our Sukkot meal fulfills the mitzvah (commandment) of welcoming guests.

With a formula established by the kabbalists in the 16th century, based on the earlier *Zohar*, on each night of Sukkot we invite one of seven exalted men (and today, women) to visit in our *sukkah* with us. We perform a short ceremony to welcome these *ushpizin*.

The full text for the invitation that they join us is printed in a full daily/festival prayer book.

Then, on the first day we say, "I invite to my meal the exalted guests, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Aaron, David, Sarah, Rachel, Rebecca, Leah, Miriam, Abigail, and Esther – May it please you, Abraham and Sarah, our exalted guests, that all the other exalted guests dwell with me and with you – Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Aaron, David, Rachel, Rebecca, Leah, Miriam, Abigail, and Esther." On each day, a different pair of the seven is singled out, in order.

We often don't have to look further than our own family histories to find heroes and heroines, leaders and teachers. Who from your family (or from history) do you wish you could sit in the sukkah with this year? What would you like to learn from them?

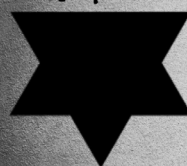

## SOCIAL ACTION IN ACTION

### RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE

On Sunday, September 6 we opened the doors of the synagogue to the Red Cross for our bi-annual blood drive. The need for blood donations are great. Many blood drives have been canceled, but we are proud that we have been successful in having two during these difficult times. We could not have accomplished this without the heroic efforts of Ruth Zerlin and Debby Portney. *Yasher Koach* for your commitment to ensuring the success of the program.

### YAD EZRA

We were scheduled to make Yad Ezra deliveries August 30, but because of the ongoing COVID-19 crisis things have changed. Yad Ezra has instituted a new method of providing food to their participants. In the past, clients were able to come into the warehouse and shop for their preferred products. Only their housebound clients received home delivery on Sunday. This is the program we have been supporting. In an effort to protect the clients and the volunteers, they have moved to a delivery service for all clients. Yad Ezra is currently delivering to over 1,300 families monthly and they could not do it without volunteers. The volunteers drop off the food on porches or in building lobbies. There is no direct contact with the clients. This outreach is needed more than ever.

You will be added to the list and 2-3 times a week will receive an email with a link to register for a specific date. Yad Ezra will load the groceries into your car and you will be given all the information to deliver to the client.

The South Oakland Shelter had to redesign their delivery of temporary housing for the homeless services during the pandemic. However, there are many volunteer opportunities to support their ongoing efforts to provide food for those in need. 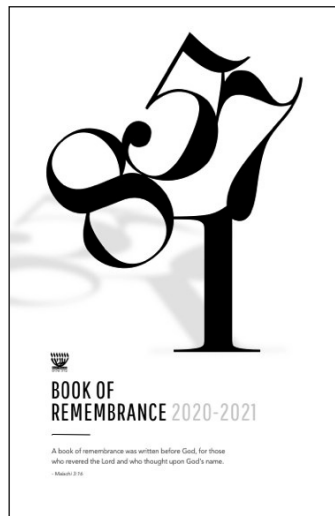

Hashkiveinu also appeals to God to shield us from enemies, war, famine, sorrow, and the plague of pestilence. The Hebrew word for pestilence is *dever* which may sound familiar as it is one of the ten plagues from the Passover story. The word pestilence itself comes from the Latin for "plague," and is defined as a deadly disease that affects an entire community. In other words, an epidemic or pandemic.

I have always found the connection of Hashkiveinu and Sukkot to be especially meaningful during this time of year, but I never would have imagined that this prayer would be applicable to the modern day plague which is afflicting all of humankind. It is a powerful example of how a prayer can take on an entirely different meaning from one day to the next. Hashkiveinu concludes with the blessing, *Baruch Atah Adonai, hoporeis sukkat shalom aleinu, v'al kol yisrael, v'al yerushalayim* — "Praised are You, Adonai, Who spreads a shelter of peace over us, over all God's people Israel, and over Jerusalem."

May God protect us all during this trying time of uncertainty and divisiveness and may we all be able to find peace and serenity in both the physical sukkah and in God's divine *sukkat shalom*.
