

DAT SHALOM IS EXCEPTIONALLY PROUD to present Israeli music sensation Noa athis month. Also known as Achinoam Nini, Noa is a singer, songwriter and percussionist of Yemenite/Israeli/American origin. Together with her long-standing musical director and guitarist, Gil Dor, she

has captivated audiences the world over with her unique music and passionate performances and has released more than 15 albums which have sold millions the world over.

Blessed with an angelic voice and magnetic stage presence, Noa has been compared to Barbara Streisand, Joan Baez, Joni Mitchell, and countless other musical giants. Noa sings in six languages and represented Israel in the 2009 Eurovision Song Contest, performing in Arabic, English, and Hebrew before an audience of millions.

FROM RABBI BERGMAN CELEBRATE ISRAEL IN ISRAEL

1018 IS AN IMPORTANT YEAR for Israel and for our own congregation. We will be celebrating the 70th Anniversary of the State of Israel, and the 75th Anniversary of Adat Shalom Synagogue.

RABBI BERGMAN

Let me begin with Adat Shalom. Our congregation began in 1943 as the

Northwest Hebrew Congregation. The timing of this is so powerful to me. That was a time of terrible darkness for our people. The extent of the devastation of the Shoah was becoming clearer and clearer, and antisemitism was still rampant in America. The very future of our people was in doubt. Nonetheless, a group of proud and visionary Jewish Detroiters said that we have to live with optimism and courage. They began holding services in a basement, and then, with foundingRabbi Jacob Segal, took our congregation to wonderful

CROSS THE BACK WALL OF ADAT SHALOM'S ASANCTUARY, you have probably noticed the beautiful memorial lights. Each week we turn on the lights for those who have a yahrzeit. Four times a year, on Passover, Shavuot, Yom Kippur and Shemini Atzeret, every single

light is lit. That is because those are the days in which we say the special Yizkor prayers. We said these prayers last month on the 8th day of Passover and we will be saving them next on the second day of Shavuot.

There is no switch that can turn on all the lights at once, so traditionally the maintenance staff of Adat Shalom turns on each of the approximately six thousand bulbs by hand. This year, however, we thought it would be meaningful to invite people who have family member plaques on the wall to come in before Shavuot and turn their families' lights on themselves. Since Shavuot starts the evening after Memorial Day this year, we invite you to come in on Memorial Day, Monday May 29,

FROM RABBI YOSKOWITZ HERESY: JEWISH, CHRISTIAN, ISLAM

EWISH HERESY IS VERY DIFFERENT than the Theresies of the two other major Western religions. In Judaism, heresy is, according to Rabbi David Hartman, founder of the Hartman Institute in Jerusalem, a Jewish person's "self exclusion from the community." In contrast, in Christianity and Islam "heresy

is the rejection of belief Christians or Muslims who reject religious doctrine are no longer a part of their faith community." In contrast, "Jews who reject the most basic Jewish beliefs but still identify with the Jewish people, its values and its fate are universally regarded among Jews as one of us."

A glance at the Jewish calendar reinforces Rabbi Hartman's message. In April, we celebrated Passover which focuses on







It is my pleasure to share that Jessica Goldberg, a high school freshman, won a mini-grant from the Deutsch Family Micro Grant administered by the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit. This grant is an opportunity for teens to show initiative and demonstrate their commitment to building community among Jewish teens. Jessica created a program called Sib4Sib.

Siblings are just as affected by the needs of a sibling struggling with mental health as the rest of the family. The siblings have to deal with the meltdowns, the weekly therapy, and the stares the family receives in public. Siblings may feel ignored or underappreciated and thus feel the need to act out. And unlike the rest of the family, the siblings do not have an avenue to express the frustration, anger, and resentment that develop in their daily life.



Sib4Sib addresses this need by creating a safe space for siblings to share their frustrations and learn coping strategies in a support group setting facilitated by Dr. Dana Shapero, a licensed psychologist. There will be five meetings in this first session: 6 - 8 p.m. on Mondays, April 24 and May 1 and Thursdays May 11, 25 and June 8. RSVP required to attend. Join us



FROM RABBI YOSKOWITZ (continued from page 3) our struggle to become a free people. In Egypt only when we became a community did we attain our freedom.


In May, seven weeks after Passover, we celebrate Shavuot to remind ourselves of the moment when we heard the words of God on Mt. Sinai, not as individuals but as a community. We responded to the anticipation of receiving the commandments with the words Naaseh V'Nishmah—We will do (the commandments) and we will listen (to their utterance).

As a religious Jew, I believe that my relationship to God helps to give meaning and purpose to my life. I believe that our lives are diminished when we do not have a relationship with God. Yet, at the same time, I profess that our solidarity with the political and economic condition of the Jewish people is necessary in order for us to have a Jewish spiritual journey as our ancestors did on Mt. Sinai.

I urge you - in this day and age of individualism - to include yourself in the collective experience of the Jewish people. Peoplehood, exemplified by a theme of the holiday of Passover, comes before we pledge covenantal allegiance to God as we do during Shavuot.

For me, conversion to Judaism was a journey. I grew up an observant Catholic and my husband, Jason, a Conservative Jew. Jason and I educated ourselves about being an interfaith couple. We attended Sarah's Tent meetings, an introduction to Judaism class, and spoke with many people about their interfaith experiences. My parents told me that it's challenging being married, let alone with two different religions and that they were okay with me converting...initially I wasn't ready myself. Jason and I were married by a Humanistic rabbi and our son and oldest daughter went to the mikveh at young ages. As we began to observe Shabbat in our home, attend Shabbat and High Holiday services as well as Adat Shalom preschool functions, I learned more about Judaism and made the decision to go to the mikveh with our youngest daughter. Since my conversion, and with the help of our clergy and staff, I have continued to embrace Judaism. We are fortunate to have so many educational opportunities and amazing clergy at Adat Shalom.

I hope the festival of Shavuot reignites your acceptance of G-d's gift, the Torah, and if you have any questions about interfaith relationships, the mikvah or conversion, please introduce yourself to me.


