## FROM HAZZAN GROSS

## A New Machzor for a New Year



This High Holiday season we will be using a new machzor entitled *Mahzor Lev Shalem*. Introduced in 2010, *Lev Shalem* is the culmination of many years of development and combines the traditional machzor elements with some new material and new characteristics. Here is a glimpse of what you will find:

HAZZAN GROSS Lev Shalem contains all of the fundamental Hebrew prayers associated with the High Holidays. While the majority of the content of the prayer services found in Lev Shalem is

similar to our previously used Harlow machzor, there are some differences. For instance, there are some piyyutim (liturgical poems) incorporated that originated from the Sephardic and Italian Jewish traditions. There are also some piyyutim of Ashkenazic origin that were not found in the Harlow machzor. Another subtle difference is the appearance of the Hebrew text. A special font was created specifically for this machzor, which I find appealing and easy to read. Another pragmatic characteristic of the Hebrew text is that many of the prayers that are customarily sung by the congregation are printed in a bold font.

One major difference in *Lev Shalem* from our previous machzor is the translation. The prayer texts are presented in an accurate English translation which upholds the integrity of the Hebrew texts, while still maintaining a poetic flow for accessible reading and comprehension. A specific thing of note is that *Lev Shalem* does not assign God a gender.

Another unique attribute of this machzor is the commentary that occurs throughout the book. This commentary pro-

## FROM RABBI BERGMAN THE MACHZOR: TEACHING US HOW TO LIVE

The name of the daily Jewish prayer book is siddur, which means order. It reflects our hope of getting through our day in a good and healthy way, and our desire for our lives to be calm and predictable. It is the book for who we are now, or more accurately, who we think we are now.

The name of the High Holiday prayer book is *machzor*, which means to return, to go back to where we started, back to true natures. Jewish tradition says that each of us has a pure soul, a soul that can never be

tainted or ruined. This means that we have a tremendous capacity to do good, and the same capacity to do harm. We have the ability and the responsibility to choose.

We often forget this during our very busy everyday lives. The Torah reminds us that we can choose good. The *machzor* teaches us how.

The words of the *machzor* allow us to reflect on our lives calmly and openly. You do not have to say every word of the book during services. I don't. Find one or two passages or even sentences that move you or challenge you and remind you of your great potential to live in a happier and better way. Find the words that allow you to forgive yourself and at least begin the process of forgiving others. All these possibilities are in the *machzor*.

This is one of the reasons I am so excited about our new *machzor*. Aside from the more inspiring and inclusive translations of the prayers, there are many readings that express more contemporary thinking. It celebrates our place in the history of prayer. It makes a great source for preparing for services, but also for reading during them. Anything that returns you to your true and good self is appropriate. In fact, that is the entire point of these days of potential and possibility.

#### TICKETS

The Synagogue is now processing High Holy Day tickets. Extra tickets for the Main Service for adult children over age 30 or parents of members may be purchased for \$275 per ticket. Please fill out request forms for extra seats with names of **unmarried** children and/or **dependent** parents. **Checks must accompany your extra seat requests.** 

Tickets will be mailed to all members in good standing (current year's dues, building fund installment, and miscellaneous charges paid). Please take care of unpaid obligations *now* so that your tickets can be processed and mailed. If you have questions in regard to your current balance, please consult our controller, Carma Gargaro, 248-851-5100.

#### RECIPROCITY

Adat Shalom participates in a reciprocity program whereby members in good standing of other Conservative congregations *outside* Michigan may attend High Holy Day services at our synagogue. Please understand that reciprocity can be extended for a maximum of three consecutive years. For details, contact Alan Yost.

#### SEATING

In order to be assured of your choice of seats, we urge all congregants to arrive as early as possible for both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. You may save seats only up until 10:15 a.m. Please follow this rule so that all congregants may be seated in an orderly manner. We have many wonderful volunteer ushers who are eager to help you in any way possible. If you have any questions while you are in the building during the holidays, please stop at the membership information table located in the main foyer.

#### PARKING

Attendants will be on duty to direct you to a parking space. We realize that parking will be tight. WHEN LEAVING THE LOT, PLEASE WAIT UNTIL THE CAR AHEAD OF YOU PULLS OUT. WE MUST HAVE YOUR COOPERATION.

Please note that worshipers will be permitted to park in the Beztak Companies parking lot directly adjacent to the Synagogue at 31371 Northwestern Highway **on Yom Kippur only**, and not on Rosh Hashanah, which falls during the week this year.

provides historical insight, context and interpretations which provide the reader with alternative ways to approach the High Holiday prayers. Many of these prayers are found throughout the calendar year (e.g., on Shabbat), but many are specific to Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

One last feature of *Lev Shalem* is that it is infused with English readings. These readings are not only educational and theological, but also meditational and spiritual, and are intended to complement and enhance the prayer experience. Contributions come from a wide range of sources, among them Chasidic folk tales, Abraham Joshua Heschel, Martin Buber, Elisabeth Kübler-Ross, and the Zohar.

I'd like to conclude this brief overview of our new machzor with this thought. While food satisfies the belly (and some say the

**KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 7TH GRADE:** Children study with our experienced and dedicated faculty on Sundays (K-6), Mondays (7), and Wednesdays (2-7). Kindergarten and First Grade continue to be a gift of free Jewish education for Adat Shalom members. Our clergy are actively engaged in the classes, visiting regularly, teaching different units, and leading programs and communal prayer.

**8**TH THROUGH **12** GRADERS take part in a community high school program called ATID, the Alliance for Teens in Detroit. On Monday evenings, teens come together to learn with the clergy and educators of the participating



Conservative synagogues in one serious and engaging core class. Additional elective offerings will take place during the week throughout the community; a December mini-mester Symposium on Israel will give students and parents the chance to learn together. The fall semester and winter Israel-focused mini-mester (September through December) take place at Adat Shalom and the

spring semester (January through April) takes place at Shaarey Zedek.

**EXPANDED HEBREW IMMERSION:** 

All students in grades K-5 will experience Hebrew Immersion this coming year, on a weekly basis.

**NEW HEBREW LOUNGE:** Our brand new *Moadon Ivrit*, Hebrew Lounge, allows self-paced Hebrew acquisition. Any students who need extra help, or who need a faster, slower, or self-paced setting, attend the *Moadon Ivrit*, which simultaneously accommodates students at all ranges of the learning spectrum. The room is staffed by a licensed social worker and a number of Hebrew tutors and teacher assistants. Students succeed at their own pace, with the goal of reaching or surpassing the benchmarks set forth in the Hebrew curriculum. An *Opening the Doors* specialist, part of a program of the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit, works with students on a one-to-one basis both in the Hebrew Lounge and in the classroom.

**FAMILY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES:** Coordinated with the new curriculum, family education programs incorporate different types of learning opportunities: parent-only learn-

ing with clergy or educational staff parallels what is happening in the classroom, and parent-child learning offers a new topic in a hands-on way. Congregationwide learning



*return to their country* (Jeremiah 31:17 - See Machzor *Lev Shalem*, p. 113). This message reinforces the examples and messages of other great Jewish leaders who preceded Jeremiah.

When Abraham's wife Sarah dies, he planted the seeds for a Jewish future in the Land of Israel by buying the first Jewish plot of land in Hebron, where he buried her remains. Then he initiated finding a wife for their son Isaac to ensure continuity of Jewish family life in Israel. Abraham built for the future.

Moses gathered the Jewish People and reviewed their forty years in the desert. Then he delivered prophecies about the Jewish horizons in the future. We will chant these messages from the Book of Deuteronomy in the synagogue in August and in September.


With that in mind, I will share insights that I learned this summer about Kol Nidre, about the Book of Jonah, and about repentence at our Adat Shalom Lunchtime Learning sessions in August. During our sessions on Jonah, I will reflect on my memories of Irwin Alterman ''' as he chanted the words of this book on so many Yom Kippur afternoons at Adat Shalom.

This summer when "the livin' is easy," I hope that you will take time to read, to reflect and to join my clergy colleagues and me as we share our insights and those of our tradition with you during the Jewish month of Elul. Perhaps our studies will help us to feel closer to God, to each other, and to the inner core of our beings.


