



Included in the best of these hidden gems are the vast local music scene and the stellar musicians in our midst. 

A Way Into Our Synagogue History

Adat Shalom wasn't born yesterday, you know.

- Know what was going on at Adat Shalom in the '60s and '70s?
- Were you, a relative or friend of yours confirmed there in the '50s?
- Ever hear one of Rabbi Jacob Segal's sermons back in the day? Want to read one of many?

Well, wonder no more because hundreds of synagogue and member-related documents dating from 1934 to 1995 can be perused in the Jewish Community Archives Collection at the Reuther Library of Wayne State University.

The Adat Shalom collection has resided in the Archives since 1997 and is accessible at *reuther.wayne.edu/node/2184*. There's yet another option: Visit the Archives for yourself (M-F, 10 A.M.-4 P.M.). The Reuther Library, on the Wayne State campus, at 5401 Cass Ave., has a treasure trove of historical Jewish community material.

And if you want to talk to an expert, it's Robbie Terman, director of the Leonard N. Simons Jewish Community Archives, located at the Max M. Fisher Federation Building in Bloomfield Hills, 248.203.1491.

Robbie also leads the Friends of the Archives, which holds a number of events that help those searching for family histories. Check out the local Archives website at jewishdetroit.org/archives and enjoy the search!

And Speaking of Local History...

How about enjoying a **FRIENDS** virtual tour of 1940s-1960s Northwest Detroit, led by Margery Jablin 11:45 A.M. Wednesday, December 11 at Adat Shalom?

Presented in partnership with the Michigan Jewish Historical Society, the program follows the move from old Hastings Street into the more modern Northwest Detroit neighborhoods, where Jews initially faced restrictions. The growth of the area came with housing, retail shops, schools and synagogues – and with them the first and second generations of American Jews.



LEARNING COMMUNITY NEWS

My younger brother and I used to wake up early on Thanksgiving morning to watch children's television before the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade started. But the Thanksgiving morning I remember the most wasn't because of the floats or the giant balloons. On Thanksgiving morning 1983, Sesame Street aired the episode in which everyone learns that Mr. Hooper, the long-time grocer of the neighborhood, has died. The producers intentionally broadcast the episode on Thanksgiving morning -- in a time before VCRs and streaming -- because they knew parents would be home to sensitively discuss the topic with their children. Indeed, this episode is still one that I use today when teaching children about life and death; it strategically ends with a newborn baby joining the Sesame Street family. (You can find it on YouTube under "Sesame Street - Goodbye, Mr. Hooper").

Time Magazine notes that "When Will Lee, the actor who played store owner Mr. Hooper on the Street, died of a heart attack in December 1982, the show's producers decided not to just write him out with an easy story line. Instead, they incorporated his death into the script. In a poignant scene broadcast on Thanksgiving Day in 1983, nearly a year after Lee's death, Big Bird struggles to grasp the concept that he won't see his friend again. By treating the subject gracefully but directly, the show helped shape the way its young viewers could cope with a delicate, painful topic."

Big Bird asks, "Why does it have to be this way? Give me one good reason!" and Gordon answers, "Big Bird, it has to be this way ... just because."

The month of November begins on the 3rd of Cheshvan, my father's tenth yahrzeit. This Voice article is dedicated to the memory of Mendel ben Simcha haLevi, Marvin Bernstein, "just because."

BEING A POSITIVE JEWISH ROLE MODEL

Our Learning Community (aka Hebrew school) has an amazing cohort of teens who choose to continue being part of the Adat Shalom community on a weekly basis after their B'nai Mitzvah. Beginning in the eighth grade, teens may volunteer or work within the school as a Madrich or Madricha, a teacher or office assistant. While gaining valuable life and work skills, teens participate in regular trainings to learn how to best assist the teachers and their students. Our Madrichim are positive Jewish role models who also work with students one-on-one in Hebrew reading, help students on assignments, lead activity stations or games, and much more. Part of building community in our classrooms is showing younger students that Jewish learning and engagement continues after becoming a Bar or Bat Mitzvah – and having teens in the classroom makes this message come alive. In addition to being part of our Madrichim program, many of these teens volunteer with the Teen Volunteer Corps, attend Nosh & Drash, go on our teen trips, and/or are enrolled in Hebrew Class with FMU.


