





# MESSAGES



### FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOAN CHERNOFF EPSTEIN

As a young child, August was a month that was always filled with sunshine, outdoor activities, vacations and fun. And September was a time of new beginnings for me. New friends, new teachers, new classrooms, new experiences... but in this world of sheltering in

place and social distancing, our August and September are sure to look different this year. Where have our yesterdays gone?

We have spent much of our spring and summer adapting to our new normal. Our days have been spent at home while we look for ways to fill our time. We have been physically distant from our loved ones and it has given us the time to reflect on how we can improve the lives of those we love.

It is very appropriate that the month of Elul is a time for reflection. It is a time to look back at the past year and to envision our hopes for change and improvement in the New Year. The new normal may have prevented us from "punim to punim" or "face to face" physical experiences, but fortunately, we have all managed to stay "virtually" connected.

There are certain changes that occur to the liturgy during the Aseret Y'mei T'shuvah, "The Ten Days of Repentance" period that lasts from the beginning of Rosh Hashanah until the end of Yom Kippur. One change that I'd like to focus on occurs within the Kaddish. There are

four forms of Kaddish that are found within the synagogue liturgy: Kaddish Shalem (Full Kaddish), Chatzi Kaddish (Half Kaddish), Kaddish Yatom (Mourner's Kaddish), and Kaddish D'Rabbanan (the Rabbi's Kaddish). All four forms undergo the following simple, yet profound, change during the High Holidays – in the third paragraph, the word I'eila is repeated.

L'eila means "higher" and in this context it is the description of how our praise to God, the essence of Kaddish, supersedes all other prayers. During the High Holiday season, we double this word in order to magnify the essence of the prayer. However, by adding an additional l'eila, we then need to make a second change to the words that follow it. On other days, the wording is l'eila min kol, but on the High Holidays it is l'eila l'eila mikol. Notice that the two words min kol ("from all") become contracted to the one word mikol, which has the same meaning. Why is this? The answer lies in the use of gematria, the association of words and meaning with Jewish numerology.

First, let's lay the groundwork of the explanation. Kaddish is the ultimate expression of praise to God which is to be recited with others. The second paragraph congregational response of confirmation, *Y'hei shmei raba m'varach l'alam ul'almei almaya* ("May God's great name be acknowledged forever and ever") is seven words long, containing twenty-eight Hebrew letters. Likewise, the very first verse of the Torah, *B'reishit bara Elohim et hashamayim v'et ha'aretz* ("In the beginning God created heaven and earth") is also seven words long, containing twenty-eight Hebrew letters. This striking coincidence of the identical number of words and letters provides a strong connection for the creation of the bond between ourselves, our community and God.

Every decision I have made and will continue to make is based on the health and safety of all of you, even if that is frustrating and challenging to all of our wishes to reconnect in person. We can substitute different ways of praying. We cannot bring back a life once it is lost. We will reopen with joy and not regret.

I am so grateful to the incredible people I work with, clergy, educators, staff, and our endlessly dedicated lay leaders. They have built an online community in so many creative ways, one that is open spiritually, emotionally, and intellectually. I am pretty sure, though, I will never use the word zoom when this is over, even if I am just trying to describe getting somewhere quickly.

Mostly, I am so grateful for all of you, and wish all of us sweet, happy, and healthy new years for many years to come. May we all be inscribed for life.

Now, let's venture one step further. If you continue counting the number of words of the aforementioned congregational response and add to it the number of words from the following paragraph that contains the phrase *l'eila min kol* (not counting the final two words *v'imru amein*) there are a total of twenty-eight words. When the liturgy was codified, the Sages realized the importance of keeping the total number of words within the Kaddish intact. Therefore, when the second *l'eila* was added for the High Holidays, the two following words had to be contracted (*min kol to mikol*) to keep the word count the same.

So what is so special about the number twenty-eight? In gematria, the word associated with this number is *koach*, which can mean power, strength, energy, ability, force, and authority. By keeping the number of words at twenty-eight, it is our way of showing the multifaceted essence that this powerful prayer maintains within our liturgy and within our lives. I pray that God continues to give us *koach* as we embrace a High Holiday season unlike any other that we have ever experienced. May the year 5781 be a year of health, peace and happiness.



The Shabbat following *Tisha B'Av* (the ninth of the Hebrew month of Av) is called Shabbat *Nachamu*, the Shabbat of Consolation, referring to the opening words of the weekly reading from the Prophets. It is the first of seven *haftarot* noted for their theme of consolation. Shabbat *Nachamu* is always paired with *Parashat Va'etchanan* in which we read the *Shema* and the 10 Commandments.

In the first verse of the Torah portion, Moshe recalls how hard he prayed to be let into *Eretz Yisrael*. What he did was no ordinary praying. He must have concentrated his entire being and essence on that one request. That is why he uses the word – *Va'etchanan* – a word that means not just "I prayed," but "I pleaded." Despite his wonderful prayer, God denied Moshe's request. This denial teaches us something important about the purpose of prayer. Getting what you want is not the point of prayer. You might get what you request, but the fact that you don't does not mean that your prayer was a failure. On the contrary, your prayer has allowed you to concentrate your emotions on something very important to you. So even if you don't get what you want, your prayer is a good one, even a great one. Always remember that even Moshe Rabbeinu, greater than all the prophets, did not get what he wanted when he prayed.

### Adat Shalom-Beth Achim Learning Plan 2020-2021

We have spent this summer confronting the unique challenges that COVID-19 presents to our learning community. As Jewish educators, we are motivated by the Talmudic statement in Shabbat 119b that "the world only exists because of the learning of schoolchildren." But as Jews, and as your friends and neighbors, we are always bound to make pikuach nefesh, the preservation of life and health, our top priority. After many hours of consultations with medical advisors, health and safety authorities for local public schools, colleagues across the country, and parents of our students, we have concluded that holding classes in person in our building at this time is not in the best interests of our students, staff, and community.

But every challenge is also an opportunity. Through much thought and energy, we have come up with a plan that provides our students with a meaningful, productive, and safe path forward during these times. The program outlined below balances the needs of families and teachers and provides quality learning that meets our educational philosophy: teach each child according to their needs, so that they will flourish. Until it is safe to return to our building, students will learn online with their teachers and friends, in both group classes and oneon-one sessions. But online doesn't mean boring or disengaged. There will be cooking competitions, trivia and games, escape room activities, virtual tours, and more. We have made massive efforts to design and train our teachers for this program, and even though the changes entail added costs, we have decided not to pass those costs on to you, but to keep tuition as it has been. And while this new remote learning plan is exciting in its own right, we are also prepared to return to in-person classes in our building, as soon as it is safe to do so. As things continue to evolve, we will evaluate our program and make changes as necessary.

### Ikar: Core Learning

All of our students learn about Torah, Jewish values, life cycle events, the Jewish year, culture, Israel, history, and more. Wednesdays are dedicated to a focus on Israel, making sure our students have the background they will need as they grow. Ikar sessions also include games to get children moving around, and activities to build and maintain friendships.

### K'riah u'Tefillah: Hebrew & Praver

Every student in grades 2-7 will have a 30 minute weekly Hebrew lesson, one-on-one, with the same teacher. Students will continue to master the liturgy by reading, chanting, and understanding core vocabulary and prayer concepts. Students learn at their own pace with a dedicated teacher.

### B'chirah: Choose Your Own Path

When students have choices, they are more engaged. Students will explore topics they are interested in, during two different sessions each week. These topics will include: Israel Exploration with our Shinshinim, Maker Space Challenge, Drumming, Tikkun Olam, Art Exploration, Torah Lego, Cooking by Parashah, Modern Hebrew Speaking, You be the Judge Debates, God and Prayer, and Hebrew reading practice in small groups. We are planning for three rotations, so students can experience up to six different topics throughout the year.

### **Guided Independent Study**

Does your family want to learn something together? Is your child fascinated by a topic that's not part of our Core Curriculum? This is your opportunity to have a guided independent study online with a faculty member or one of our clergy.



August 21 is the first day of the month of Elul. This is the month leading up to Tishrei which includes: Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah. That's a lot of holidays! Elul is traditionally used as a time to prepare for these holidays. There are a lot of ways to prepare. During this time, we should ask ourselves questions. What is something I struggled with this past year? What is a challenge I faced? How did I help others? Did I take care of myself?

This Elul I challenge families to reflect together and as individuals. Maybe the whole family can dedicate 10 minutes a day to journal and answer these questions. Try making a Reflective Paper Chain for your Sukkah. Each day every family member can write or draw their response to a question on a strip of paper. Keep adding on to your chain and you will have a beautiful (and long) chain to put in your Sukkah. Oh, you don't build a Sukkah? We can help with that or you can put it up around your house.

I'd love to see all the chains you make during our family holiday programming. Take pictures, use it as your background on the next Zoom call. Make a chain and notice how we build off of each other and support each other even during challenging times but especially take note that even if you don't always do something well, your family and community are there to help you grow.


