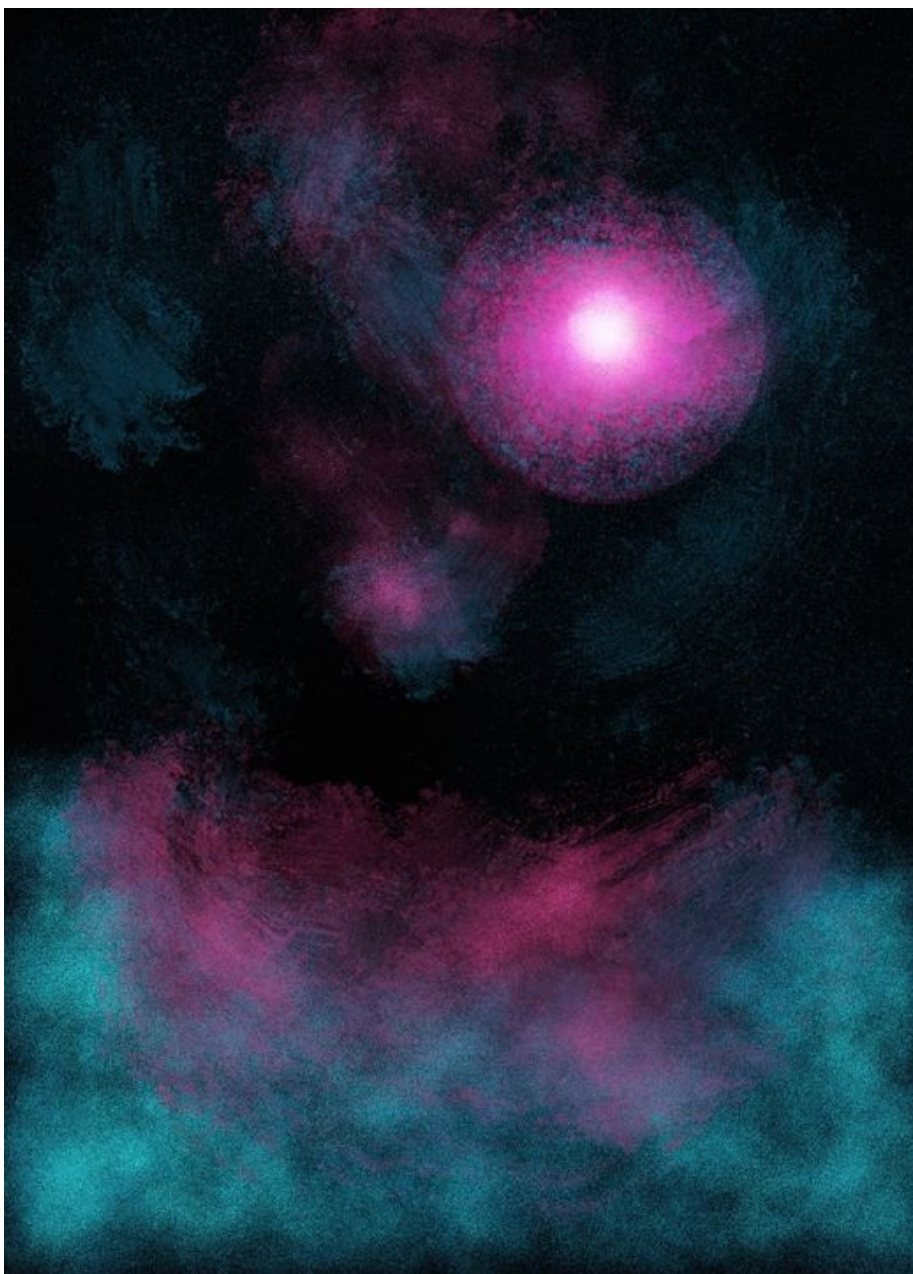
Evening Minyan Changes to 5 PM

FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOAN CHERNOFF EPSTEIN

"Let us fight unto death in defense of our souls and our temple!" The Maccabees were Jewish Freedom Fighters, led by Mattathias and his sons. They banded together with a supportive community of Jews in pursuit and defense of religious freedom.

Just as the Maccabees came together, I am reminded that we as a congregation have also banded together during these challenging times as we celebrated the High Holy Days, and as we now enter Kislev. The clergy, staff, and members of Adat Shalom have all come together to support, encourage and connect with one another in a beautiful way. As you may know, Kislev means support – for those who have fallen, or are struggling, or just need a boost. I have been inspired and amazed at how our congregation has come together. So many of you have sent encouraging messages to our clergy and staff, and I too would like to thank everyone in the Adat Shalom community for their support. Each one of you from the congregation to the entire staff, to the clergy keep us bound together in support of one another.

A perfect example of this is seeing you all on Zoom for our High Holy Days services. We had almost 1,000 electronic devices and Facebook participants involved. Estimating 2 people on each connection, that's roughly 2,000 members - about as many as we would have seen in the sanctuary! Many of you were skeptical at first to celebrate with only Rabbi Bergman and Hazzan Gross at Adat Shalom, but the clergy had a plan - a plan that included many moving parts of participation: you had an Aliyah, you read from the Torah; you blew the Shofar; you sang solos; and one of you even made an appeal to the congregation.

FROM HAZZAN DANIEL GROSS **LIKE A ROCK**

To many of us, the three words, "Like a Rock," are synonymous with both Bob Seger and Chevy trucks, as it was Seger's song used in Chevrolet's successful ad campaign in the 1990s and early 2000s. These words also have a theological connotation, as "Rock" is one of the many monikers that we have for God. The Hebrew word for rock is *tzur*, and you may recognize it from the Chanukah anthem, *Maoz Tzur* ("Rock of Ages"), which is sung every night immediately after kindling the candles on the menorah. The word *maoz* can be translated as either refuge, sanctuary or fortress. *Maoz Tzur* is a *piyyut*, a liturgical poem or hymn, written in 13th century Germany. The poet is unknown, but we do know that his first name was Mordechai as the initial letter of the first five stanzas spell out his name.

An interesting piece of information about the history of *Maoz Tzur* is that the beginning part of the traditional melody is based on a German folksong that was eventually adapted by Martin Luther into a church chorale during the early 16th century. As the melody became more widespread, it became utilized for this Jewish *piyyut* that recalls various painful exiles that the Jewish people endured; it also praises God for redeeming us from these exiles.

The truth of the matter is that a great deal of our music has been acquired from other cultures – and not only the music. Many of our cultural and liturgical origins stem from a myriad of non-Jewish sources and communities that surrounded and paralleled our own. Our heritage is colored by having borrowed from this richness of diversity. This contributes to the beauty of Judaism.



FROM RABBI AARON BERGMAN

I normally love everything about Thanksgiving. The food is great, the football games are predictable, and the family is together. This year's Thanksgiving is far from normal. Many families, including my own, will not be fully together, except on Zoom. It is not getting easier. Spiritually connected is important, but not being together at the

Thanksgiving meal is pretty tough. Not quite Seder tough, but close. Hopefully, next year we can all be around the same table with our loved ones.

I am going to suggest a different approach to thinking about Thanksgiving this year. I call it "Thanks taking." Let me explain. The Jewish community is wonderful at giving. There are so many generous and charitable people and organizations. We have much to be proud of. We have always looked out for each other's welfare even when we have disagreed with each other's opinions.

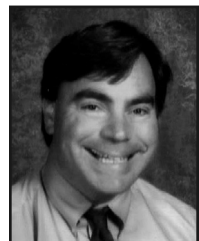
What has been harder is to convince people that there are times that they should be taking. The economy has been devastating to a lot of people, including people who were used to giving to others, and now are in terrible straits themselves. They need help. Help is available, but they are hesitant to take it. They do not feel that they should be taking from the community.

The mitzvah of giving is possible only if there are those willing to receive help. If you need help, you should think of yourself as helping someone else do a mitzvah, which is in itself a mitzvah. There is nothing to be embarrassed about.

Sometimes in our lives we are going to be the givers, and other times the takers. Life changes. What does not change is our commitment to each other, whatever our role is at the time.

There are so many places in the Jewish world waiting to help. Let them help, and when you are back on your feet, you will do the same for others.

We all need each other. We are all responsible for each other. *Kol Yisrael aravim ze laze*, we are all connected.



FROM MICHAEL WOLF DIRECTOR OF SPIRITUALITY AND OUTREACH

A snippet from my Voice article last year – "As we begin 5780 I am planning to focus on the "outreach" part of my position - using the definition of "outreach" as a verb - "to reach further than"... My intent was to start (reinvent) *Chavurot* – small groups of congregation

members, which meet regularly, usually once a month in each other's homes, to create bonds of friendship. That was so fall of 5780...

Zoom has allowed us to reach further. Members in Florida are able to join our services, we are able to keep connected to members who moved to Boston and Kalamazoo and interact daily with Zoominnyanaires from Toronto and New York.

I am letting go of the *Chavurot* idea (for now) and shifting to *Chevrutah* – also from the Hebrew word *Chaver* – Friend. *Chevrutah* is the traditional rabbinic approach to Talmudic study in which a small group of students analyze, discuss, and debate a shared text. I am hoping you will join me in learning Mishnah together on Zoom Tuesday mornings at 9 AM in November. We will be starting at the beginning with Tractate Berachot, just in time to recognize all of our blessings as we enter into Thanksgiving. Hope to see you on Zoom soon!

Making it all happen smoothly was like solving an intricate puzzle of great magnitude. We had so many parts which needed patience and perseverance to lay out in the correct manner, piece by piece, edge to edge and top to bottom. It was a work in progress from Rosh Hashanah to Yom Kippur, and it was improved by incorporating your suggestions, such as adding Michael Wolf reading aloud with the congregation's responses to the Rabbi's prayers. This resulted in very special interactive and connected services. We couldn't have done it without your help and input. Thank you.

Service participation in our own homes made for very intimate High Holy Days. Although we were not physically seated together in the sanctuary, we could hear Hazzan Gross' magnificent voice and familiar melodies fill our Adat Shalom sanctuary and our homes. We could view in awe when the plaques were lit in memory of all those who once had been, and see the beauty of our loaned Sefer Torah. Grandchildren could ask questions without hearing "shhhh," and we could all absorb the sermon in our own way.

Rabbi Bergman spoke with words of wisdom to which we could all relate. His sermon on Yom Kippur spoke of the uniqueness of each of us, bound together by one common thread – the Torah. He asked each of us what letter from the Torah we would choose to be. Because my Hebrew name is Chana Malka, I chose the letter Mem, which has many meanings, including "the flowing stream, the source of wisdom." Rabbi Bergman's sermon provided me an opportunity to connect to our Torah, admiring it's wisdom and beauty. The Torah is our unifying thread, and its wisdom is the water that nourishes us in our daily life. Through his question, I learned so much. Please take a few moments and decide which letter you would choose to be. I encourage you to connect to the Torah; to connect to Adat Shalom; to connect to each other; and more important, to connect to yourself. We are always learning.

Remember, the Maccabees banded together, connected, for their beliefs.

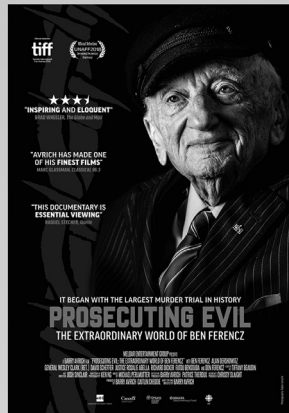

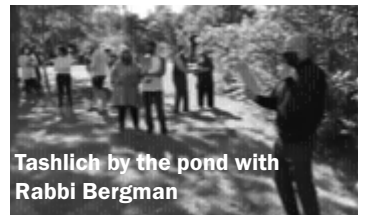

"Managing Stress in Uncertain Times"

Over the past several months many people have noticed an increase in their day to day stress levels. At the same time, some of our traditional ways of coping with stress are falling short. The good news is that we can all learn how to manage our stress better. This workshop focuses on helping people recognize the stress process and learn to interrupt it early in the cycle, before it escalates. Many individual stress management techniques are discussed, as well as a specific model for understanding the effects of stress on our emotions, our brains and our bodies.

Lynn earned her B.S. degree from MSU and her M.S.W. in Interpersonal Practices from U of M. As a Certified Health Coach, Lynn currently heads up the Chronic Disease Management programs at Jewish Family Service. Lynn also serves as adjunct faculty at Madonna University's School of Social Work.

HOPE HOSPITALITY AND WARMING CENTER

In the past, we have always provided meals for the participants at the Hope Hospitality and Warming Center in Pontiac for four nights beginning on December 25. In the past, this was only an overnight place to stay. In an effort to keep everyone safe and well during this COVID-19 pandemic, the Center is currently a 24/7 program. Social distancing and an isolation shelter have helped to keep the shelter virus-free. However, volunteer groups are not coming in and making dinners and lunches. They hope to resume the normal rotation when it is safe.

Of course, they continue to have significant needs to meet the needs of their clients. Their wish list includes bleach, hand sanitizer, toilet paper, and Kleenex. Additional information and items needed are available on their website hopewarmingpontiac.org. If you would like to donate any items, I would be happy to pick them up from your home and deliver to Hope. Alternately, you could make a donation to the Maisel Housing the Homeless Fund at Adat Shalom. Designate that it is for Hope and I could arrange to purchase some of those items.

Being a Positive Jewish Role Model

Our Learning Community (aka Hebrew school) has a caring, dedicated and knowledgeable cohort of teens who choose to continue being part of the Adat Shalom community on a weekly basis after their B'nai Mitzvah. Beginning in the eighth grade, teens may volunteer or work within the school as *Madrich* or *Madricha*, a teacher or office assistant. While gaining valuable life and work skills, teens participate in weekly trainings to learn how to best assist the teachers and their students. Our *Madrichim* are positive Jewish role models who also work with students one-on-one on Hebrew reading, help students on assignments, lead activity stations or games, and much more. Part of building community in our classrooms is showing younger students that Jewish learning and engagement continues after becoming a Bar or Bat Mitzvah – and having teens in the classroom makes this message come alive. 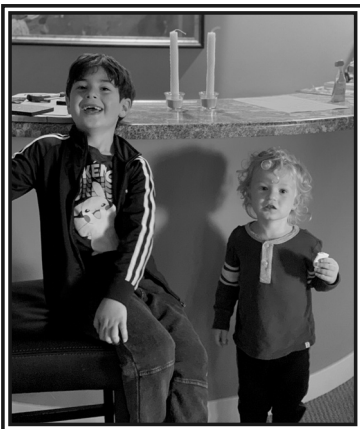

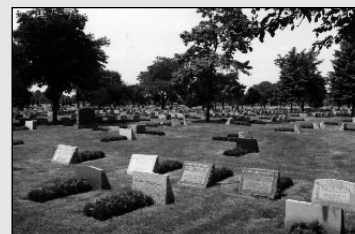
