

MESSAGES



FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOAN CHERNOFF EPSTEIN

Welcome to a new year, full of all the promise of new beginnings; but also full of new challenges and transitions—and the changes they all may bring. We are often unprepared for change when it takes place. I remember as a child when my father told our family we'd be moving. I feared

what changes our move would bring to my small world: a new home, a new neighborhood, a new school, and new friendships.

The Torah is full of stories of the changes our people endured, and how they coped with loss of their possessions, homes, family and lands. As I reflect on this time of year, I can't believe how time has flown by. It has been 16 years since my youngest son, Brandon, was having his Bar Mitzvah. Brandon's Torah portion was Bo. Moses and Aaron warned Pharoah of the coming plagues if he did not free the Israelites, yet Pharoah continued to deny their freedom. When he finally told them to go, can you imagine the changes they endured? Having to pack up their most precious possessions and some rations, then leave everything familiar to go live in a foreign land? Those were some serious hardships they overcame.

Time passes, things change, life throws us curve balls. Yet we adapt and persevere. This past year brought us so many changes we never anticipated, and we adapted and persevered. Our Synagogue has seen many changes: going to services on Zoom; holding remote meetings, programs, social events, and classes; adding new members; and losing congregants to death, moves, divorce or affiliation changes. Yet one thing that is constant is your unwavering support. I am so appreciative of the commitment and generosity of our congregation. I want to personally thank you for responding to the Yom Kippur appeal so openheartedly. This helped us meet the continuing challenges of serving you during a pandemic. I also offer a special thank you to Joyce Weingarten, Jackie Issner, and Alan Yost, who joined me in our special outreach to many congregants.

FROM HAZZAN DANIEL GROSS THE MOST TRAGIC PROBEM IS SILENCE

Rabbi Joachim Prinz may not be a household name, but he played an important part in a historic American event. Prinz, a young rabbi in Nazi Germany, immigrated to the United States in 1937 and had firsthand knowledge of the ugly effects of prejudice and discrimination.

In the mid- to late 20th century, Prinz was the rabbi of Temple B'nai Abraham in Newark, New Jersey and served as President of the American Jewish Congress. He represented the Jewish community as one of the organizers of the August 1963 March on Washington, whose focus on bigotry and oppression remains relevant in our own time. Rabbi Prinz had the honored but formidable task of speaking to the crowd of a quarter million people immediately after the great folk singer Odetta and before the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. An excerpt of Rabbi Prinz's stirring speech follows:

When I was the rabbi of the Jewish community in Berlin under the Hitler regime,-... the most important thing that I learned under those tragic circumstances was that bigotry and hatred are not the most urgent problems. The most urgent, the most disgraceful, the most shameful and the most tragic problem is silence.

I am always amazed and impressed by how many of our people risk themselves, either financially or physically, in order to help other people, including those who might hate them for being Jewish. Antisemitism never goes away, but neither does our people's commitment to making things better in the world.

Israel continues to send help all over the world, including nations that do not recognize its right to exist. American Jews help all Americans, even though antisemitism is increasing on the right and the left. So many Jews help other Jews who do not recognize the kind of Judaism they practice.

There might be some benefit to us in doing so; maybe people will think more kindly about us.

That is not the reason that Jews are willing to take a chance to help. It is just the right thing to do. I think that is one of our most powerful qualities, and one that we constantly need to nurture.

This idea is the core of the story of Purim, and why the book of the Tanach that tells that story is called the Book of Esther.

Mordechai learned that the Jewish people in Persia were in danger of being destroyed by Haman. He asked his niece Esther to risk everything by hiding her Jewish identity and marry King Achashverosh. She was to persuade him to save her people, even though she cannot tell him that she herself is Jewish.

She gave up a lot just by marrying him. She saw what happened to the last wife, Vashti. He had a lot of other women in the harem, any of whom could have replaced her. He was no prize himself. He drank a lot and tried to impress his friends, who were all eunuchs, with his romantic successes. He had a bad temper. She could have been killed at any moment.

She did not have to risk her life. She could have stayed where she was, or once she was queen, she did not have to tell Achashverosh anything, and just stay rich and safe in the palace.

She did not do that. She had no reason to think that what she did would work. Haman was a smart and powerful enemy. She risked it all because it was the right thing. She saved the Jewish people. She saved her whole country, because Haman would not have stopped with Jews. Hatred and paranoia doesn't limit itself to just one group.

Mordechai may have come up with the plan, but it was only Esther's courage that made it possible. That is why the book is named after her, and not Mordechai.

This is what we have always done as a people, and need to do so in the future. We are not here just save ourselves, nor should we think that we should, but look to save the world, one person, one place at a time, no matter how impossible it seems.

We are living in a world where it seems like everyone is trying just to save themselves or just their family and friends, and do not seem to care about others. This is not the Jewish way. We are in a scary and uncertain time in so many ways, but the way we have gotten through these difficulties is not by being selfish, but by helping all of God's creation, including those we like and those we do not. In the long run, it has helped us survive when other people who only cared about themselves have vanished.

Giving in to fear, hate and despair seems inevitable, especially when we are so tired of trying to deal with an endless number of challenges. This is not who we are. Esther reminds us to always be be brave and to take chances on doing good.







We read the following in *Parashat Va'era:* "I will bring you into the land which I swore to give to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and I will give it to you for a MORASHA (heritage), I the Lord." (Exodus 6:8)

MORASHA – Heritage; literally, property (particularly land) transmitted by inheritance.

In the song we sing while marching with the Torah - Torah, Torah, Torah, Torah, Torah Torah, Torah Torah Torah Tzivah lanu Moshe, **Morasha** K'helat Ya'acov... "And when Moses charged us with the Teaching as the heritage of the congregation of Jacob." (Devarim 33:4), Morasha is a metaphor for a spiritual possession, connoting something vital and cherished.

Thursday, January 14 is Rosh Chodesh Shevat. It was on the first day of Shevat that Moses began to deliver his final address to Israel. For thirty-seven days, Moses spoke to all Israel concluding on the seventh of Adar, the day of his death. It is for this reason that the Rabbis said that Rosh Chodesh Shevat is comparable to the sixth of Sivan, Shavuot, the day on which the Torah was given to Israel at Sinai. The Rabbis teach that the first of Shevat is well suited for renewed inspiration in the study of Torah!

Pirkei Avot, Chapter 2 Mishnah 12: "Rabbi Yosse said: Let the property of your fellow be as precious to you as your own; and make yourself fit for the study of Torah, for it is not yours by inheritance..." In the second part, Rabbi Yosse is teaching us that Torah study is hard work. The Torah does not pass genetically from parent to child and no one acquires it without the necessary mental exertion...I hope you will take time for yourself to get more physically fit and more spiritually fit come visit us on zoom - let's learn together!


SISTERHOOD

Even with all the changes we have endured, there is comfort in the familiarity of what the changing months and seasons bring. Now in Tevet and Shevat, we in Michigan face cold temperatures and snow, while in Israel there is hope for rain to water the newly planted trees during Tu Bishvat. I enjoy the thought of the beauty those trees will bring when they are nourished by the rains and blossom in the springtime. Change can be good; it can bring growth. A few months ago, I watched on Zoom as many congregations came together for a community Havdalah. Rabbis from around the area participated. Our Rabbi Bergman said, in part, "may we as Jews find joy in spite of what is happening around us."

Let us find joy in small blessings around us. I am still apprehensive about changes to my now much larger world, but am comforted to know that I have the strength of our ancestors to persevere. May we all take a breath—actually several breaths—for ourselves, our families, and our friends, and help one another restore and revive.

A great people which had created a great civilization had become a nation of silent onlookers. They remained silent in the face of hate, in the face of brutality and in the face of mass murder.

America must not become a nation of onlookers. America must not remain silent. Not merely black America, but all of America. It must speak up and act from the President down to the humblest of us, and . . . not for the sake of the black community but for the sake of the image, the dream, the idea and the aspiration of America itself.

While this country has made some progress in the battle against racism, there is still much work to be done. The current resurgence of public acts of hatred needs to be countered with positive action and love. As we observe Martin Luther King Jr. Day on January 18 and Black History Month in February, let us never forget the words of Dr. King: "The ultimate tragedy is not the oppression and cruelty by the bad people but the silence over that by the good people."




