

The Torah prohibits Jews from owning chametz during Pesach. For those who wish to adhere to this tradition, Adat Shalom will be happy to arrange for

the contractual (virtual) sale of your chametz to a non-Jew for the duration of the holiday. According to this contract, your ownership of your chametz will end at 9 A.M. on 13 Nisan (March 26) and will be restored at 9 P.M. on 22 Nisan (April 4).

You may arrange to sell your chametz beginning Monday, March 8, through 8:30 A.M. on the morning of Friday, March 26.

It is customary, but not necessary, to make a contribution to the synagogue for requesting that we act as the agent for the sale of your chametz. If you wish to do so, we suggest a \$20 donation to Adat Shalom's Minyan Breakfast Fund.

FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOAN CHERNOFF EPSTEIN

As I reflect back on what I was doing last March, it boggles my mind how things can change in a flash. I, along with my sister Cathy, had just finished celebrating with many of you at our Purim party, Missebaba. Can you imagine? Well, I guess you can! That was just one year ago and so much has changed in our daily lives.

Purim has just passed, sadly without our joyous Missebaba, but we were able to bring some sweetness into your lives with our drivethrough Mishloach Manot pick-up.

Nisan brings with it what I call the Season of P's: Plan, Prepare, Participate, Passover, Purpose, Patience, being Present... the list is endless. Of all the "P's", Participation stands out as a means for all of us to come together. Your participation plays an integral part in helping our Synagogue continue to thrive. Participation brings with it a sense of unity, satisfaction, engagement, contribution, and cooperation. It helps our Synagogue become richer, more vibrant and welcoming. In return, we get a sense of belonging to something so much larger than we are individually. It's the ultimate "win-win" opportunity!

This was abundantly evident in this winter's wonderfully successful Volunteer Day Box. Over 100 congregants picked up a box full of all sorts of supplies for projects designed to help the greater community. The sheer number of volunteers, items produced by you, and organizations benefitting was astounding. Volunteers crocheted waterproof blankets for the homeless, made note cards for the residents at the Jewish Senior Life homes, packaged snack food for health care front line workers, and provided packages to mitigate the struggles of those with food insecurity. By February, all the project boxes were returned and I saw the bounty of these efforts still being distributed to a variety of area organizations. This effort was so heartwarming. It was evidence of what we are capable of doing as a congregation, with the volunteers and the recipients benefitting each in their way. It started out with a simple idea and blossomed into so much more, bringing joy to all involved. I want to applaud Jodi Gross for this wonderful idea and bringing it to fruition. I also want to thank Sammi Shapiro, and all the volunteers who contributed to making it a success. Indeed, it was a very unifying, satisfying, and engaging project.

Now we are looking forward to spring 2021, and beginning to think and plan for Passover. Last year, I was fortunate to have Passover with my children and grandchildren, who were staying with us. And my son and daughter-in-law, as well as my youngest son, had collectively decided that we would be together. But the absence of those who were not present with us tugged at our hearts: my sister, my niece and her family, and most important my parents.

All the planning and preparation we were accustomed to has changed at least for a year, but that doesn't by any means mean that we cannot participate this year in a different way that's safe for all. We continue to find creative ways to meet new challenges. At times like these, when our "normal" has been altered so suddenly, and things feel so out of control, we can center ourselves by becoming immersed in activities that support us and our anchor, Adat Shalom.



FROM RABBI AARON BERGMAN

Purim of 2020 was really the last time the whole community was able to celebrate a holiday together. Pesach of that year was the first socially distanced holiday. We were all hoping that by Pesach of this year we could go back to celebrating in person with all of our family and friends. I pray that we are getting

closer and closer to that day, but it seems like we are still going to be relying on Zoom for a while.

Yizkor of Pesach is the first Yizkor service of the year, and it is the service which we get strength from each other when we remember those for whom we grieve. It is a time to come together in gratitude for the strength that our ancestors have given us, for the courage they demonstrated. Maybe not your immediate family, but the Jewish people throughout history have been remarkable for the power and character within our souls.

Yizkor is a tough time under any circumstance. We may feel broken, sad, scared, or anxious, no matter how many years it has been since we lost someone.

Passover begins with brokenness. The middle matzah. We hold it up and say "all who are hungry, come in". It is a recognition that we need each other to fulfill the mitzvah. We are all hungry for connection.

Passover ends with a different kind of brokenness. We read of the splitting of the sea, and of how it did not open until we were ready to go through it. Moses had said to Pharaoh, "Everyone comes out of Egypt, young and old, healthy and sick, men and women, boys and girls." No one was expendable.

At the sea, we remembered this. We were afraid, but we went through it together. We made a miracle happen. It did not solve all our problems, but we survived and learned that we can make it to the other side of a crisis.

This is why we pray for peace at each of our services, including the Kaddish. Oseh shalom, make peace above and below. Shalom is from the word shaleim, which means wholeness.

No one person is whole. We are all broken by grief, whether it was the grief of losing a good relationship or the grief that comes from a relationship that brought us pain, or because of COVID-19 the pain of being separated physically. We are whole when we come together. The broken pieces fit together. It makes us a congregation of wholeness, literally an Adat Shalom. It is what makes the Jewish people so strong.

This Pesach, we may not yet be able to be together in the way that we would most want, but we are still together, still connected through our souls. May we all find comfort in our memories, and joy and gratitude in each other.

FROM HAZZAN DANIEL GROSS PRAYERS FOR THE VACCINE

Blessings are Judaism's way of allowing us to be aware of the present moment. They are an expression of gratitude for the many gifts we may experience on any given day. The Talmud (Menachot 43b) states that a person is obligated to recite one hundred blessings every

day. In Shacharit (the daily morning service) alone there are more than forty blessings. In addition to daily blessings, there are also blessings that are recited only on certain occasions. Shehechayanu is one of these blessings: "Praised are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of the universe, Who has kept us alive, sustained us, and allowed us to reach this moment."

Traditionally we recite Shehechayanu on the following occasions: the annual advent of a holiday; when a ritual is observed for the first time in a year; at certain life cycle events; upon arriving in Israel; and upon wearing new clothes, eating a new food or acquiring a significant possession. There are, however, many other moments worthy of Shehecheyanu. Saying this blessing is a way of capturing the uniqueness of a new experience and elevating it to become a holy and memorable moment. Of the countless Shehecheyanu moments in my life, one of the most powerful occurred just recently when I received the COVID-19 vaccine. Thanking God for keeping me alive, sustaining me and allowing me to reach this moment during such a precarious and unprecedented time was an emotional and cathartic experience. To also acknowledge the countless people whose continuing work in creating and dispensing vaccines that are crucial for us to get back on the road to a life of safety, trust and health, I also recited the following prayer:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה ה׳ אֶלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הַעוֹלָם רוֹפֵא כָל בָּשָׂר וּמַפְלִיא לַעֲשׁוֹת בִּידֵי כָל יוֹשׁבֵי תֵבֵל.

Baruch Atah Adonai Eloheinu melech ha'olam, rofei chol basar umafli la'asot bidei chol yoshvei tevel.

Praised are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of the universe, Who heals all flesh, working wondrously through human hands.

As we continue to make headway in testing for and vaccinating against the COVID-19 virus, I pray that you are able to find the beauty and holiness in both the big and little *Shehecheyanu* moments in your day, and that one day very soon we are able to share these moments together in the same room.



FROM MICHAEL WOLF
DIRECTOR OF SPIRITUALITY AND OUTREACH

Why are the four questions asked as part of the Passover seder?

The common answer is that the questions are asked to involve the children and they provide the impetus for telling why this night is different from all other nights. But why couldn't

this custom to involve the kids be done in the Sukkah or during another holiday?

Rabbi Chaim Meir Bukiet, z"l, taught that on Passover we celebrate our freedom from slavery. A slave is allowed no independent will, no opinion, and cannot question authority or voice his thoughts. With freedom the Jewish nation was given the possibility to ask, to question.

The idea of Passover in our personal lives is about becoming free from our internal constraints. Only by probing what Judaism is, asking and seeking more, can one become free from his or her current state, and reach a higher spiritual level. The asking of the four questions symbolizes that quest.

An early version of *Ma Nishtana* can be found in the *Mishna Pesachim*, 10:4. The Mishna there relates that after the second cup of wine is poured at the Seder, a son should question his father. The Mishna adds that if the son has "insufficient understanding" to come up with his own questions, his father can supply the questions for him, i.e. give the son *Ma Nishtana* to recite. The Mishna then quotes *Ma Nishtana*, but this version is slightly different than the modern one...I hope we can learn together why the version in the Mishna is different - along with some other rituals associated with Passover and the Seder.

We have daily learning during our 'one minute of fun' each evening during services. I hope we can pray and learn together on Zoom!






ADULT LEARNING

One of the highlights of this year for me has been the opportunity to work with b'nai mitzvah students and their families as they study and prepare their Divrei Torah. I am grateful to the Midwest Fellowship of the Pedagogy of Partnership, for additional teaching tools that help me teach Torah better. Pedagogy of Partnership (POP) is a comprehensive Jewish educational model that supports educators to bring Torah to the next generation. Rooted in Jewish values and practices, PoP enables learners of all ages to develop the habits of wonder, empathy, and responsibility toward others and Torah. PoP conducts professional development workshops. coaching, a fellowship program for a growing network of schools, and provides ready-to-use materials for educators, leaders and families. In this time of physical distance, the PoP approach restores relationship building to its central place in education and promotes connectivity. For the Tu Bishevat / January 2021 Journal, I was asked to contribute a Dvar Torah.

The Torah service has a peculiar arc to it: we begin with a communal recitation of שמע ישראל as we remove the Torah scroll from the aron kodesh, and following the community's reading of the weekly Torah portion, we conclude with עץ היים היא. Of all the texts that could be chosen to bracket this part of the service, why these? And what is the relationship between these two texts? There is a clue in Taanit 17a, where Rav Nahman bar Yitzhak explains:

Why are Torah matters likened to a tree, as it is stated: "It is a tree of life to them who lay hold upon it" (Proverbs 3:18)? This verse comes to tell you that just as a small piece of wood can ignite a large piece, so too, minor Torah scholars can sharpen great Torah scholars and enable them to advance in their studies.

There is a relationship between the branches of the tree, just as between two scholars who are exploring a text together. A minor Torah scholar can ask a burning question that leads a great Torah scholar to clarify her ideas and sharpen her understanding of a text. It is their proximity - their relationship - that allows one branch's flame to ignite another. Even a strong branch can be ignited and burn alone, but it requires additional fuel to grow larger and stronger.

Nowhere is this clearer than in the episode of the burning bush. Until Moshe enters into a relationship with the voice speaking from the flames, it is just another shrub in the wilderness. Moshe, though, is astounded by this bush that burns but is not consumed by its fire, and wonders why the bush does not burn up המדוע (Shemot 3:3). It is only at this point of wonderment that God invites Moshe into the relationship. Moshe's response of המדוע (ibid. 3:4) demonstrates that he is not only physically present, but also prepared to engage in the conversation and begin learning how to lead this people.

The conversation begins here and culminates at Sinai, where the mountain is alight with flames but, once again, not consumed by them. There, Moshe recounts, the voice of God had emanated from the fire (אליכם מתוך ה' אליכם מתוך ה' אליכם מתוך ה' אלקנו ה' אלקנו ה' אחד Devarim 4:12). And amid the fire and thunder and lightning and smoke, the people heard אלקינו ה' אלקינו ה' אחד That is, the very words that we use to introduce the communal reading of the Torah were the words that were used to introduce the Israelites to the Torah itself.

Preparing for Pesach can feel daunting. There is a lot to accomplish and sometimes including the kids can be challenging. Here is one activity that can be used in a few different ways.



Here's how to do it:

- 1. Choose a theme
- Cut out circles (to make this even easier use sticky notes)
- 3. Label and decorate each circle to fit your theme
- 4. Glue the top third of each circle and place on large sheet of construction paper
- 5. Write facts beneath each circle

How does this work for Passover? This can be easily adapted. In my example, I went through each of the symbolic items on the seder plate. I read about each item and wrote down the facts that I found most interesting. You could have everything completed before your seder so that your kids can share about these items when you reach that part of the seder or you could have the kids write questions or facts that they hear while listening and participating in your family's seder.

This could be done for all 15 steps of the seder, the four questions, or the ten plagues.

It's always fun to try new ways to engage our whole family during this special holiday.

What do these six words mean? While the most common translation of them is "Listen, Israel, Adonai is our God, Adonai is One," the rabbis wonder about this particular word שמע: Is the obligation to say the words, or to hear them - and what is hearing? The answer: אינו שאתה שומע (Brachot 15a) means any language in which the listener is fluent. Without fluency in the language, there is no attuned listening or deep understanding, and surely no grasping of the nuances of the text. Likewise, our communal affirmation after Sinai of אינו וושמע indicates "we will do and we will understand" (Shemot 24:7) – not just "we will do and then we will listen."

How do we put this all together? The small branch ignites the larger one; the student sharpens the teacher. The small burning bush is the start of the preeminent hevruta - God articulates and Moshe listens, challenges, supports, and asks for clarification. God learns from Moshe as well, implementing a process for repentance at Moshe's request (Shemot 34:9-10). From the first conversation in the wilderness of Midian to the fiery summit at Sinai, Moshe's relationship with God ignites the community's relationship with God, and Moshe in turn becomes the teacher to the masses. When we replicate that moment at Sinai in removing the Torah from the ark, we open with the words spoken out of the fire at Sinai.

The Torah requires a partner in order to be heard, to be understood, and to be grasped. We enter that partnership when we grasp onto the Torah and seek meaning and understanding. When we gather to read Torah, we acknowledge the importance of hearing and attuned listening. In reading and discussing the Torah, we bring our burning questions to the forefront. And when we close, it is with a subtle reminder from our sages that the smallest branch can ignite a larger one, and that the Torah, our Tree of Life, is ever-present למחזיקים בה (lamachazikim ba) for those who grasp onto it.

Can or Can't we do Donor Day 2021? Donor Day, honoring Joyce Weingarten, was penciled in to take place May 6, 2021. 



This variety of hands-on volunteer projects helped many organizations in our community and Metro Detroit improve lives. Together we spread kindness in more ways than we could have ever imagined.

- ~ 95 books were donated between S.O.U.L Source of Universal Love and Brilliant Detroit.
- ~ 360 snack bags were decorated and filled with treats for staff at Henry Ford Hospital West Bloomfield.
- ~ Over 200 caring cards, 85 beaded necklaces for face masks and 30 facemasks were donated to Jewish Senior Life of Michigan.
- ~ 5 meal kits, 4 birthday party bags, 10 activity bags for kids were donated to CARES of Farmington Hills.
- Over 200 lunch bags were decorated and filled with good food along with 100 pounds of toiletries and 1 box of socks for clients at Hope Warming Center.
- ~ **40** balls and **1** box of strands of plarn (Plastic yarn), **55** blankets, **2** boxes of food, **1** box of gloves, socks, hats for kids were donated to Song and Spirit Institute of Peace. The balls will be crocheted into sleeping mats for people who are experiencing homelessness.
- ~ **150** pounds of toiletries and **2** boxes of food were donated to Yad Ezra.
- ~ **20** colorful bracelets were donated to Project 1:2. Hundreds of fleece pieces donated by the National Council of Jewish Woman Michigan "Wrapped in Love" project were upcycled to make the dog tug toys and chain scarves.
