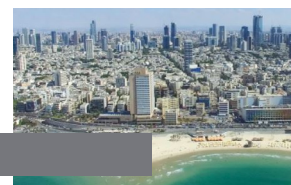
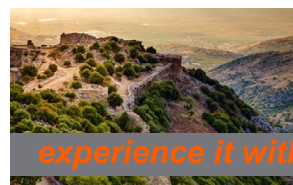

FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOYCE BERLIN WEINGARTEN

Happy summer to everyone! I am honored to write my first article in the Voice as your president. I look forward to serving you in this new role and getting to know you better. I am sharing some of my acceptance speech from the installation on June 3.

I grew up at Congregation B'nai David where I attended Hebrew School. My husband Jeffrey and I were married there by both of our clergy, all of blessed memory, Rabbis Yolkut and Spectre, and Cantors Adler and Vieder. We moved to Albany, New York for Jeffrey's urology training and returned to Michigan in 1990 so our children Emily and Elliot would grow up near their grandparents just like we did.

When we moved home, we needed a preschool and would eventually need a religious school for our children. Jeffrey's grandparents, Belle and Maurice Rosender of blessed memory became members of Adat Shalom in the second year of its inception. My mother and father-in-law Ruth and Charles Weingarten are second generation members. We joined Adat Shalom making us third generation members and our children the fourth generation in that legacy. We enrolled Emily in preschool and Elliot and I attended parent-toddler class. I felt comfortable and I was excited that the children were happy at Adat Shalom.

One afternoon in 1993 Executive Director Alan Yost called, asking me to chair the Social Club. I knew that accepting the invitation would change my life at Adat Shalom and I then began my journey here. Jeffrey and I chaired the Social Club and I sat on the Board of Trustees. I chaired other affiliates and served as Sisterhood President. I later served as Sisterhood Co-chair with Beverly Yost and Trudy Weiss. I have served on the Executive Committee for the past 14 years.

For over three decades Adat Shalom has been my spiritual home. I studied with Rabbi Spectre and Cantor Glantz to become an adult Bat Mitzvah 27 years ago. I developed a love of chanting Torah and Haftarah and I now lead weekday services. My family and I traveled with Rabbi Danny Nevins to Israel on the first Adat Shalom Family Mission where we celebrated Emily's Bat Mitzvah. I later retired from dental hygiene and have tutored B'nai Mitzvah students at Adat Shalom for nearly 20 years. I am passionate about this work and proud of my students' accomplishments.

All of my work at Adat Shalom has prepared me to be your president. I look forward to working with our exceptional clergy, Rabbis Bergman, Horwitz, Nosanwisch, and Yoskowitz, Hazzan Gross, and our new Executive Director Michael Wolf. I am excited to work with our devoted Education and Youth Department directors, Dr. Melissa Ser, Jodi Gross, and Sammi Shapiro. Prayer Connections

There are numerous prayers that I say that remind me of certain people, certain places, and even certain times of my life. When someone tells me that they love a particular melody, I immediately connect that person to the prayer and melody. From that point forward, if I happen to see that person during a service, there is a very good chance that I will incorporate the melody that they adore.

There's one particular prayer and melody that always brings me back in time to a certain place. The prayer is *Shalom Rav*, found in the last blessing of the Amidah in both the Minchah and Maariv services. It is a powerful prayer for peace for all people and for all time. The nostalgic melody we sang at camp was composed by Jeff Klepper, one of the most influential Jewish songwriters of our time.

When I sing this melody now, I am transported to my early teens to the outdoor Friday night service by Lake Buckatabon at Camp Ramah in Conover, Wisconsin. I have vivid memories of everyone being freshly showered, dressed up in their Shabbat best and then coming together in both body and song. When everyone sang *Shalom Rav* together, it was magical.

At this time of year, I look back and am grateful for the privileged experience of being able to attend such a special place. I am also grateful for this prayer of peace that connects me to my past, and I feel blessed to have continuing new opportunities to connect it to those who sing this prayer with me now and in the future.

FROM RABBI DANIEL S. HORWITZ

The first time I visited Israel, I was 10 years old. My father took me on a trip with him lasting roughly a week. I admittedly remember very little of it... but there are snapshots that still jump out at me. I remember feeling incredibly jetlagged and thinking that Israeli pizza tasted funny. I remember drinking a glass of watermelon juice

for the first time on a kibbutz. No one at home ever served glasses of watermelon juice with breakfast! I remember trying to race my dad to see who could finish John Grisham's "The Client" first on the trip (whether that was an appropriate book for me to be reading at age 10 isn't the point!). I remember meeting distant (but not really that distant) cousins, along with other extended family members for the first time. I remember being amazed at the energy of the place, the warmth of the people, the immersive Hebrew environment, and cherishing the special time with my dad.

I've been back many times since, sometimes for quick trips (like the 4-day one I just took), and sometimes for months (like when I studied abroad in undergrad). I love the people, the smells, the food, and the topography, all of which are diverse. I don't love the bureaucracy and the unwillingness of people to wait patiently in line – especially when disembarking from the airplane once it lands in Tel Aviv!

I feel incredibly grateful to be able to represent Adat Shalom and help shepherd almost 100 teenagers from our Metro Detroit community as they experience the best of Israel this summer on the Sue & Alan Kaufman & Family Teen Mission. The teens will crisscross the country from top to bottom, and from sea to sea, over the course of roughly 3.5 weeks. I'll be with them for just over a week, and view it as my personal responsibility to ensure that they ask as many questions as possible, build meaningful bonds with the people and place, and that they eat as much hummus as possible (assuming I leave any for them – I may eat it all myself!).

I'll look forward to reporting back about the experience! Yalla! Let's Go!

FROM RABBI BLAIR NOSANWISCH
Reflections on a Year With Adat Shalom

This July, I will transition from my role as Director of Spiritual Care into a full-time clergy position. My time as Director of Spiritual Care has allowed me to clarify my particular *avodah* (service) as part of Adat Shalom, as well as how I want to do that work.

My experience of thriving, joyful, committed Judaism is that it is a team sport, and I have made it my business to strengthen the team of Adat Shalom. I have a vision of a community where our amazing lay people and our talented professionals work hand in hand to build and sustain the programs and the worship that is most meaningful to us. Any class or program we offer is an opportunity to get to know one another and to start to build community around shared interests. Don't be surprised if I call you after you come to a program to ask you what you thought—that is the work of building together. Community is built on knowing that you are needed, and I believe we need one another.

In the realm of spiritual care, I am proud of the seeds I've sown. We have increased communication and feedback between the clergy team and the staff to make sure that we are keeping up with those who experience a setback, illness, loss, or a simcha! We are actualizing a long stated intention to call each of our members before the 2022 High Holidays (Yes! This is actually happening! You will receive a call from one of us before Rosh Hashanah!). We have created Bereavement Circles—two ongoing monthly spaces, differentiated by age and life stage, where those who have lost a loved one can gather together and receive support in community.

As I look to the horizon, I have many goals. Among them are:

- To bolster our committees, in particular Tikkun Adat, so that we can have thriving pastoral care not just from the clergy but from our lay leadership as well.
- To support the building of Shabbat morning community for our younger generations (MiniMinyan), as a complement to our monthly clergy-led programming (Shalom Shabbat), so that our families with young children can make Adat Shalom the place to be on any given week.
- To nourish and celebrate our parents of teens and college-age students as they navigate the challenges of parenting in the 21st century.
- To explore together the impacts of climate change on our personal and communal lives so that we can look ahead to the future with hope.

In all these efforts, I will turn to you, the Adat Shalom community. Whatever we can build *together* will be more beautiful than what any of us can imagine alone. May all our efforts be for life and for blessing.

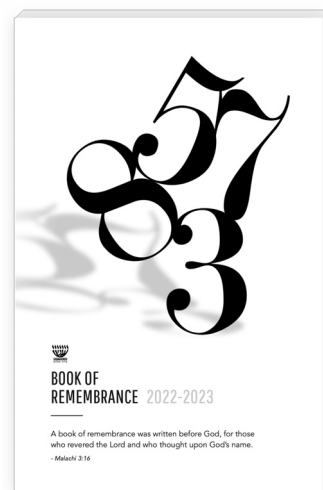
BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

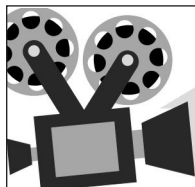

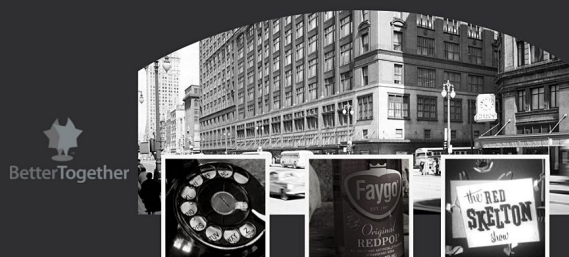

With a new school year on the horizon, we are so excited to share some highlights for the upcoming year. In all of our classes, Pre-K through 7th grade, students develop their knowledge of Judaism, holidays, the calendar, life cycle events, history, ethics, Torah, and Israel. Children begin formal Hebrew learning in second grade, and will have a weekly one-on-one lesson either in person or virtually.

Our building will be full of students again midweek as we reopen our Wednesday afternoon in-person learning for second through seventh graders. For those who cannot make it midweek in person, there's a virtual option as well - students will take part in a hybrid specialty track and a virtual core class! Specialty tracks include:

- **Beit Midrash: Torah & Tradition** (hybrid class) With your friends, learn HOW to learn Torah, Midrash, Mishnah, and some Talmud too!
- **Get Creative: Jewish Art** Hands on projects explore various themes in Jewish life, including symbolism, holidays, and rituals.
- **Rhythm, Music & Drumming** Hang out in our music room with djembe drums, darbukas, shakers, and even a piano – and learn Jewish and Israeli music (and maybe even write your own).
- **Taste of Torah: Cooking by the Weekly Parashah** You'll learn about each week's Torah portion by digging into some recipes and creative food presentations! This class involves cooking and eating!
- **Judaism and the Environment** Have you wondered what Judaism says about how we care for our planet? In this class, we will learn and work together to put these values into action.
- **Get Moving: Israeli Dance, Yoga, Krav Maga, and more** If jumping, running, dancing, and moving around is your style, you'll enjoy learning through movement
- **Get Reading: Hebrew Reading & Prayer Practice** Once a week lessons not enough? Do you like to learn in a small group or by playing games? Faculty and teens help our students learn to read and support the work they are already doing with their individual tutors.

As part of the culmination for this school year, Madrichim reflected with our dedicated Learning Community faculty before learning about and volunteering to plant colorful flowers in the Haley Nathan z"l Memorial Garden on the playground, and make food (cheese sandwiches, carrots, cheese, and fruit cup boxes, healthy no-bake cookies, and snack bags) for a Detroit Community Fridge. With the help of Mara Stein who is an excellent healthy cookie baker, the teens made enough food to fill the entire refrigerator in the Brightmoor neighborhood. The Detroit Community Fridge is a grassroots group that is focused on feeding its neighbors. There are four refrigerators in Detroit that are always open to anyone who needs food any time of day. The teens said they enjoyed volunteering and being part of something bigger than themselves.

Volunteering is one way many teens connect to being part of the Jewish community. Volunteer opportunities continue this summer.

6th to 12th graders are invited to volunteer at the 5th Annual Youth United Interfaith Community Service Camp from Tuesday, August 9 to Thursday, August 11 at the CARES Community Center in Farmington Hills from 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Teens will enjoy doing a variety of hands-on volunteer projects and have opportunities to talk with teens from other faiths while helping clients of CARES and Foster Closet of Oakland County.

Adat Shalom is one of the founding community partners of Youth United. Sammi Shapiro and I are part of the planning committee and look forward to volunteering with teens from Adat Shalom and their friends. Advance registration is required:

We say the *shehechyanu* throughout the year as we mark the passage of time. Each time of the year that we do something for the first time, it's customary to say the *shehechyanu* blessing, thanking God for opportunities to reach new milestones. As we settle into summer, what are some of your "summer-only" *shehechyanu* moments? Do you take an annual trip to a lake? Visit your favorite summer camp? Road trip for the best ice cream in the state (I say Dairy Store at Michigan State but there are a lot of votes for Moomers in Traverse City as well)?

Summer is a time when we are able to recharge and revisit our favorite activities. Looking to start a new tradition? Here are some easy, local ideas:

- Visit a new park or splash pad (of course, Adat Shalom can help with this—we have summer pop ups all over town!)
- Have you explored the RiverFront recently? It's been named one of the best in the country!
- Make popsicles or ice cream (or try a new flavor!)
- Pick out a new board game for your family to play
- Check out a local museum
- Wear a new swimsuit or outfit (yes, it's traditional to say this blessing on new clothes and shoes)

Whatever you do, make sure that if it is a new experience for your family or if it's the first time you've experienced it this year, you say the *shechyanu*:

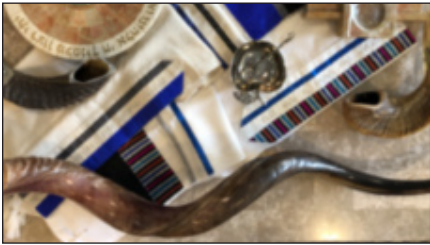

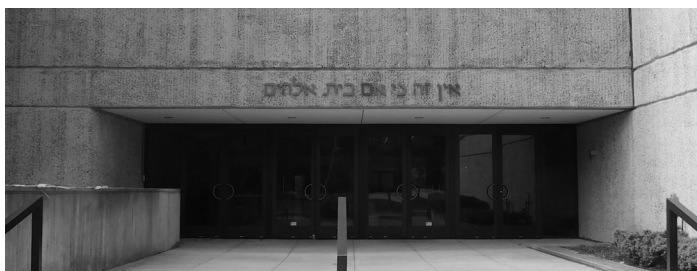

What's THE STORY

Let's explore our synagogue. As an ongoing column in The Voice, we will discover the history behind some of the wonderful artwork, Judaica, and building features of our synagogue that surround us, teach us, intrigue us, and always welcome us at Adat Shalom.



Ein zeh ki im beit Elohim אין זך כּי אים בּיט אלהים

These six words come from the second half of verse 17 in chapter 28 of the book of Genesis. They translate to **"This is none other than the house of God."** The context is right after Jacob wakes up from his dream of the ladder reaching up to heaven with angels going up and down on it. In the dream, God promises him land and an abundance of descendants, both of which will be blessed.

Rabbi Jacob Segal, Adat Shalom's first spiritual leader engaged by the synagogue in 1946, utilized his biblical namesake's expression of awe towards God and a holy place by making this biblical verse the first thing someone sees when approaching the doors of the synagogue building. Rabbi Segal also employed text from the previous verse upon the sanctuary ark doors, which say "Surely God is in this place and I did not know it."
