# MESSAGES



## FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOAN CHERNOFF EPSTEIN

This newsletter arrives following a flurry of year-end activities, into a time which often brings reflection: on memories of celebrations and rituals; on our loved ones recently deceased; and on our heritage and its strength which we can draw from when we are in need. I think fondly of friends and family near and far, and those we

have lost over the year. It is a mitzvah to even be able to connect on Zoom to remember the departed, to learn stories we never heard before, and to be inspired by ways they touched others.

January is a new calendar year and brings with it much promise: more opportunities to return to familiar activities; resolutions to clean the house of things we no longer need; to catch up on correspondence; maybe to lose a few pounds.... But let's all make a promise to connect on a deeper level with friends and acquaintances. The days are shorter, colder, and often greyer, and needing to be brightened by friendship.

I encourage you to reach out to a friend or acquaintance you haven't seen for a while, just to connect, let them know you are thinking of them and are grateful for their friendship. This simple gesture is uplifting to both you and to whomever you call. So, let's bring some warmth to those we care about. We all need a little "pick-me-up" to know we are cared for, loved, and connected to something greater.

And for all of you, here is a big hug from me to you. This is a sure-fire way to warm up your heart... and your mealtime. The best recipes are on a page showing stains from many years of use, and this is no exception! I have held onto this classic Latke recipe for over 30 years. It comes from a booklet our children received from Adat Shalom - an A to Z Family Chanukah Guide. I share with you our favorite Latke recipe from the booklet (plus a few optional adaptations), and have taken the liberty to adapt many of the children's booklet's A to Z entries to give you a more general list of all the ways you can find love and comfort from Adat Shalom during these winter months.

Potato Latkes (serves 6-8)

Ingredients:

9 medium potatoes (or frozen, grated Ore-Ida hash browns for ease, or sweet potatoes for healthier version)

2 medium onions, minced

3 eggs, slightly beaten (or 6 egg whites for healthier version)

3-4 tbsp. matzo meal (ordinary barley cereal tastes best; or buy gluten free matzo and whirl in a blender)

1 tsp salt

1/8 tsp pepper

1/2 tsp baking powder

Neutral oil

(Note: you may need to add matzo meal to hold them together)

Instructions:

- 1) Wash, peel, and grate potatoes. Place in a colander and let stand for 10 minutes, then press out remaining liquid.
- 2) Mix potatoes with onions (the onions may be lightly fried first) and eggs.
- 3) Add matzo meal, salt, pepper, and baking powder. Mix well.
- 4) Heat about 1/4 inch of oil in a large skillet and add a scoopful of latke mixture. Fry until golden brown on both sides.
- 5) Keep in warm oven (180F degrees) until time to serve.
- 6) Serve with applesauce, sour cream (or plain yogurt), jam, powdered sugar, or cinnamon.

## FROM RABBI AARON BERGMAN

I normally don't believe in angels, with one exception. When I would tuck my daughters in at night. I would look at them and think how I would do anything for them to make them safe and teach them how to keep themselves safe. I still tear up when I hear those songs.

I would sing them a song about guardian angels:

In the name of God, the God of those who Struggle, may Michael be at my right hand; Gabriel at my left; before me, Uriel; behind me, Raphael; and above my head the divine presence of God.

I would sing another song with words from the Torah that describe Jacob's dark night of the soul:

The Angel who has redeemed me from all harm— Bless the children. In them may my name be recalled, And the names of my fathers Abraham and Isaac, And may they be teeming multitudes upon the earth."

Jacob does not say be fruitful and multiply in Hebrew, *p'ru urvu*. He uses the word *vayidgu*, which means multiply like fish. The oceans and seas can be dangerous and scary. Waters themselves can be turbulent. There are predators everywhere. If you travel together, though, you can make it, you can live with meaning and joy.

Jacob wants his family to survive challenging times, to learn to adapt and flourish. We are the descendants of Jacob. We can be each other's guardian angels and we can face life with courage and kindness and strength.

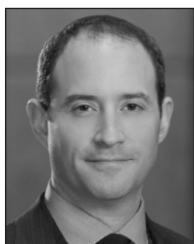
Who is this program designed for?

FROM HAZZAN DANIEL GROSS

## **LITTLE PURIM**

Did you know that there is a minor Jewish holiday called *Purim Katan*, aka Little Purim? This mostly unfamiliar observance takes place only in a Hebrew calendar leap year (which this year, 5782, happens to be). A Hebrew leap year occurs 7 times within the complete 19-year lunar

calendar cycle. The 19-year cycle keeps the 354-day lunar cycle and 365-day solar cycle in sync (technically, the Hebrew calendar is a lunisolar calendar!). The Jewish leap year, known in Hebrew as *Shanah M'uberet* ("Pregnant Year"), contains an extra month (in contrast to our secular Gregorian calendar's extra day), thus making the impregnated year have 13 months in total instead of the usual 12. An additional month of Adar is added and thus the leap year includes Adar I and Adar II – in Hebrew referred to as *Adar Alef* (or *Adar Rishon*) and *Adar Bet* (or *Adar Sheni*). If I've thoroughly confused you, I apologize! One almost needs a doctorate in calculus to be able to understand the Hebrew calendar.

During a regular Hebrew calendar year, Purim is celebrated on the 14<sup>th</sup> of Adar (there being only a single Adar). During a Hebrew leap year, Purim is celebrated on the 14<sup>th</sup> of Adar II, which this year begins the evening of March 16, 2022. The reason we celebrate Purim during the **second** Adar is to keep it in close proximity to Pesach, as both holidays celebrate redemption. According to the Talmud, however, the importance of Adar I must still be recognized, therefore we observe Purim Katan on the 14<sup>th</sup> of the **first** Adar. Other than some who recognize the minor holiday with a celebratory meal and by eliminating certain prayers from the daily liturgy, nothing else unique is done to commemorate the day.

Purim Katan begins the evening of February 14 this year. While we won't be dressing up in costumes, hearing the Megillah read, making noise or giving gifts (although Valentine's Day might inspire some of you), it is nevertheless a day to appreciate the significance of Purim and recognize how our people continue to endure. We continue to find ways to celebrate each and every possible occasion!



FROM RABBI BLAIR NOSANWISCH

DIRECTOR OF SPIRITUAL CARE

From the moment I joined the Adat Shalom team, one of the refrains I heard again and again was that Adat Shalom was founded to be a community first and foremost. While most shuls were identified by their motherland, Adat Shalom stood out as a place where Detroit Jews came

together to create a shared home. At a recent staff meeting, our office staff, clergy, and education team collectively took time to delve into our synagogue's mission statement, connecting with the idea that we are a "Caring Community." We each asked what this means to us and to our *avodah* (sacred work). From compassionate listening to making sure everyone feels welcome, it is clear that "care" is one of the things we are each striving to do. Not only is care a value to us as human beings, but in particular as a religious community, we agreed that building a "culture of caring" is central to the mission of Adat Shalom.

With that in mind, I want to take a moment to shed light on one of Adat's lay initiatives which I have found particularly inspiring, Tikkun Adat. Chaired by Charlotte Dubin and Charmley Levine - the vision of Tikkun Adat was to focus on inreach rather than outreach. In other

words, these caring volunteers took note of the many needs within our community and set out to perform the kinds of small acts of *Hesed* (loving kindness) that for someone in need can feel like a miracle. From parents of newborn children who need a home cooked meal to mourners, individuals, and families who would benefit from a fresh baked challah or a shabbat dinner, this hearty crew has spent the last decade thinking about how to show up better and more consistently for our community.

Over the course of the pandemic, the need for a caring community has only increased, but so many of us have been meeting this need for caregiving in every area of our lives. The needs have at times felt overwhelming. Something I love about community is that the work of caregiving can be spread out over many willing hands. We can share in the joy of giving without becoming overburdened and burned out. We can come together to cook for those in need, and have a dance party in the kitchen while we package quarts of hot soup! We can each check in on someone we know is having a hard time. We do not have to hold the burden of care alone.

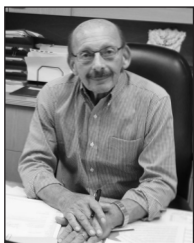

## FROM ALAN YOST, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR THOUGHTS AND REFLECTIONS

### Chapter 11, 1976 - 1984

Many of the current members may not know that Adat Shalom is one of the only synagogues that unfortunately entered into, operated under, and successfully emerged from Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings. Special recognition

needs to be given to Irving August z"l and Irwin Alterman z"l for their extraordinary efforts and legal expertise in protecting the assets of the Memorial Park separate from the Chapter 11 proceedings.

### Mortgage Retirement

There were 6 banks that held the mortgage of Adat Shalom. The lead bank, Metropolitan Savings (no longer in existence) initiated foreclosure proceedings.

In 1983 an ultimatum was given by the banks: Pay the \$3 million mortgage balance in full in the next 11 months or they would foreclose. Two synagogue members stepped up. Dr. Milton Shiffman z"l and Joel Gershenson agreed to co-chair the Ner Tamid Campaign. They used every means possible to raise the \$3 million over that 11 month period and pay off the synagogue mortgage. The lessons from that financial nightmare have proven to be invaluable.

The synagogue learned the hard way to be fiscally responsible and fiduciary. We no longer have lines of credit; we do not incur capital debt or any loans where interest payments are required.

### Rabbi Efray Spectre z"l, 1979 - 2001

Rabbi Efray Spectre interviewed me and recommended that I be hired as the Youth Director in November 1980. Although at times I disagreed with some of his policy decisions, I warmly embraced his deep commitment to the basic tenets of Conservative Judaism, strong support of Israel, and passionate advocacy on behalf of Soviet Jewry. He inspired many of our congregants to meet refuseniks in the Soviet Union and to get involved in the struggle to free Soviet Jews. Adat Shalom was at the forefront of the Soviet Jewry movement in Detroit, and well known around the country, due in large part to Rabbi Spectre's leadership. In fact, the noted former refusenik Anatoly Sharansky visited and spoke at Adat Shalom not long after he was allowed to emigrate to Israel.



### Hiring of Rabbi Daniel Nevins, 1994 - 2007

Adat Shalom decided that it was necessary to form a search committee to hire an assistant rabbi to Rabbi Efray Spectre z"l. The goal was to hire a candidate from the Jewish Theological Seminary who had the potential to become the future Mara D'Atra. The star of the rabbinical school class was a soon to be ordained Rabbi Daniel Nevins. The synagogue welcomed Rabbi Nevins and his wife Lynn Scheele Nevins over a Shabbat weekend which also included the observance of Purim and our Purim Party Plus fundraiser. To quote the Godfather, the synagogue "made an offer (to Rabbi Nevins) that he couldn't refuse".

Rabbi Nevins served the synagogue as Rabbi from 1994 through 2007. Rabbi Nevins connected with the membership and brought an enhanced emphasis on Jewish study and scholarly wisdom. Adat Shalom became a prominent synagogue in the Conservative movement. Reform, Conservative and Orthodox colleagues held Rabbi Nevins in high regard, and regularly consulted him.

As we know, he left Adat Shalom to become the Dean of the Rabbinical School at the Jewish Theological Seminary.

### The Successful Merger with Beth Achim

A group of representatives from Congregation Beth Achim and Adat Shalom began meeting in early 1998 to discuss the possible merger between the two congregations. With the goal of doing something good for the metropolitan Detroit Jewish community, the committee

worked tirelessly to negotiate a merger agreement of equals. Members of the committee representing Beth Achim were Tobi Fox, Robert Kass, Ed Kohl, and Jerry Tepman z"l, and from Adat Shalom Sidney Feldman z"l, David Schostak, and Neal Zalenko. The community benefitted in that the former Beth Achim building became the new home of Akiva Day School now known as the Farber Day School.

Adat Shalom became a stronger synagogue with an influx of members committed to the tenets of Conservative Judaism who worked on improving our outreach to synagogue membership. Adat Shalom continues to be a warm and welcoming environment.

Beth Achim rabbi, Rabbi Herbert Yoskowitz joined the Adat Shalom clergy team. Rabbi Yoskowitz is a skilled rabbi who strongly adheres to Conservative Judaism, is strongly committed to the support of the State of Israel, and excels at pastoral care.

### Rabbi Rachel Shere, 2004 - 2020

The synagogue leadership made a strong statement for diversity when they hired Rabbi Rachel Shere from the University of Judaism as a member of its clergy team and its first woman Rabbi. I used to fondly refer to Rabbi Shere as our "counter culture" rabbi. Rabbi Shere effectively outreached to the women of the synagogue, establishing study groups, Rosh Chodesh women only services, and providing pastoral and counseling services.

She connected with younger couples and families, single, separated and divorced individuals, and outreached to the LGBTQ community. She served the synagogue with commitment, dedication and passion for 16 years until her retirement.

### Rabbi Aaron Bergman, 2007 - present

Rabbi Nevins was lured away to become the Dean of the Rabbinical School at the Jewish Theological Seminary. The synagogue was faced with the need to conduct a rabbinic search for a new Mara D'Atra. Coincidentally, I was sitting shiva for the loss of my brother Farrell at the time.

Rabbi Bergman made a shiva call and we spoke while walking my Golden Retriever, Buddy. Some things are just *Beshert* (destined). The interview process commenced and we welcomed Ruth and Rabbi Aaron Bergman for a weekend interview. Adat Shalom has never looked back! Rabbi Bergman is a FABULOUS rabbi, incredibly intelligent, gifted, diversified with many interests and talents, a wonderful teacher, and a great transmitter of knowledge through written and oral communication. His most important quality is his *Neshuma* (soul). He is a caring and empathetic person who works tirelessly to serve his congregants. In my opinion, his greatest success is how he responded to the Covid-19 pandemic. He rolled up his sleeves and doubled his efforts to offer classes, lectures, arrange for speakers and other educational formats, all on Zoom. He reached out to congregants who were ill, family members who suffered losses, and counseled individuals impacted by the pandemic. His leadership has been outstanding.

### Hazzan Daniel Gross, 2009 - present

The search committee was co-chaired by David Goodman and Julie Wiener. The synagogue was flooded with many wonderful candidates for the position.

After extensive interviews the committee selected a baritone who was soon to be ordained as a cantor from the Cantorial School of the Jewish Theological Seminary.

Hazzan Gross is a world class hazzan but more importantly is a world class human being. May he continue to inspire our synagogue with his incredible voice and kavanah for many years to come!

### Rabbi Daniel Horwitz, 2021 - present

The Adat Shalom executive committee was interested in looking at the future of the synagogue and struggling with the issue of how to attract new and young families. The membership numbers had been declining due to an older membership experiencing death, relocations, retirements, divorces and apathy due to the pandemic.

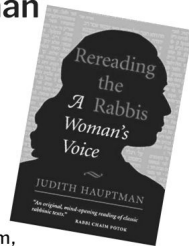

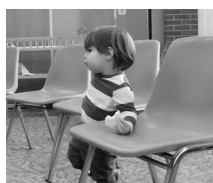

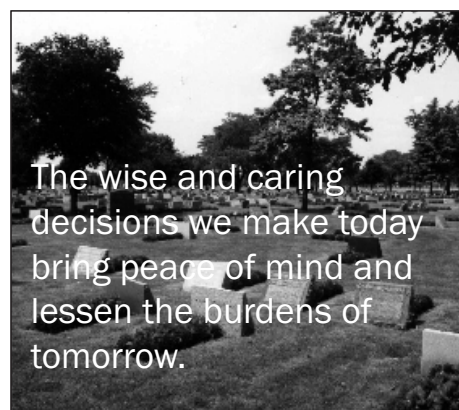
