### FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOYCE BERLIN WEINGARTEN



This year is the 75th anniversary of the State of Israel, at which time it will have survived 74 years and 364 days longer than most of the world thought or hoped it would. It is one of the great success stories, not just for the Jewish people, but all of humanity.

A people is forcibly expelled from their land, yet never gives up hope and eventually, against all odds and against all enemies, returns, revives its daily language, and builds a modern democratic state in an area of the world which is not known for embracing freedom and democracy.

This people sees its mission to bring light and redemption to the rest of the world, even if much of that world rejects it. The fact that this happened in the shadow of our greatest tragedy makes Israel today that much more impressive and worthy of celebration.

We cannot take the future for granted. Israel is in the middle of its first crisis that cannot be solved through technology or innovation or defense or surveillance. It is a crisis that can only be resolved through a deep moral reckoning of what it means to be an Israeli and to be a Jewish democratic state. Who best represents Israel to Israel and to the world? What does it mean to be an *Ohr LaGoyim*, a light to the nations? This conversation is long overdue.

I share with you sections of The Israeli Declaration of Independence that I believe are crucial for framing these discussions.

THE STATE OF ISRAEL will be open for Jewish immigration and for the Ingathering of the Exiles; it will foster the development of the country for the benefit of all its inhabitants; it will be based on freedom, justice and peace as envisaged by the prophets of Israel; it will ensure complete equality of social and political rights to all its inhabitants irrespective of religion, race or sex; it will guarantee freedom of religion, conscience, language, education and culture; it will safeguard the Holy Places of all religions; and it will be faithful to the principles of the Charter of the United Nations.

WE EXTEND our hand to all neighboring states and their peoples in an offer of peace and good neighborliness, and appeal to them to establish bonds of cooperation and mutual help with the sovereign Jewish people settled in its own land. The State of Israel is prepared to do its share in a common effort for the advancement of the entire Middle East.

WE APPEAL to the Jewish people throughout the Diaspora to rally round the Jews of Eretz-Israel in the tasks of immigration and upbuilding and to stand by them in the great struggle for the realization of the age-old dream - the redemption of Israel.

This must be a time of kindness and compassion, of compromise and humility. Israel has so much that is great about it. It has done so much for the Jewish people and the world. The world needs Israel. I pray for its continuing success and commitment to its deepest values.

The Detroit Jewish community has many strong and vibrant synagogues across the denominations. There are two organizations that connect the various clergy of these numerous congregations: The Michigan Board of Cantors and The Michigan Board of Rabbis. Each group

meets regularly in order for their clergy to connect, learn from one another, stay apprised of each other's happenings, and most importantly, bolster camaraderie.

According to the Michigan Board of Cantors by-laws, the purpose of the organization is to:

provide a professional association of cantors and full-time cantorial soloists in the state of Michigan, within which the promotion and advancement of the total sphere of the Cantorate be projected and enhanced;

sustain and elevate the status of the individual and collective image of the cantor as a duly recognized member of the clergy;

be the umbrella organization regarding Jewish music and prayer, promoting, educating, and creating awareness of its importance in Jewish culture for our congregations and the community;

and foster a sense of community within the organization and support the professional development of individual members and the entire group.

One of the highlights of the year for the Michigan Board of Cantors is our annual concert. The first concert took place in 2009, just a few months before I moved to the Detroit area. I participated in the second concert, singing both Tevye and Figaro! The pandemic put a

damper on our concerts, but we will be returning to the Berman Center for the Performing Arts on May 9 for our 12th annual concert. The concert falls on the eve of Lag BaOmer, hence the title "Lag BaOmer: A Celebration in Song." The evening will feature celebratory songs that highlight aspects of the holiday, such as outdoor campfires and weddings. Tickets for the concert are available via the Berman's website.

### FROM RABBI DANIEL S. HORWITZ Cultivating Leaders

I've been thinking a lot lately about leadership.

This past month, I had the pleasure of hosting an Adat Shalom Book Talk conversation with author Russ Linden, a national thought leader on change management. We discussed his most

recent book Loss & Discovery: What The Torah Can Teach Us About Leading Change. In the book, Linden highlights a number of different leadership archetypes represented by various biblical figures, and pays particular attention to the differing styles of Abraham, Moses, and God. Melding biblical narrative with contemporary insights, it was fascinating to see modern-day best practices being modeled thousands of years ago.

That conversation got me thinking about our own synagogue leadership, and how fortunate we are to have folks who give of themselves in service to our shul. Investing their time, talent and treasure, Adat Shalom's leaders drive our community forward, allowing us to achieve our collective goals.

In many Jewish organizations today, there are concerns about who their future leaders are going to be, and where they are going to come from. The simple truth is that leaders don't just magically appear. Rather, they need to be cultivated. So, how are we at Adat Shalom cultivating the next generation of folks who are going to step up and assume leadership roles in our congregation?

We are proud to be launching the Pearl and Sidney Forst Leadership Academy. Utilizing a cohort-based model, this multi-part leadership development series will serve as a catalyst, beginning the cultivation process, and providing a crash course to emerging leaders in synagogue essentials, including governance, budgeting, building sacred communities, ritual skills, and more.

The kickoff event for this cohort will be open to the entire congregation, and will feature Dr. Barry Franklin, who will be presenting about his recent book, GPS For Success: Skills, Strategies, and Secrets of Superachievers. In addition to being a prolific author and incredibly engaging speaker, Dr. Franklin is Director of Preventive Cardiology and Cardiac Rehabilitation at Beaumont Health, and is a professor of Internal Medicine at

Oakland University's William Beaumont School of Medicine. He is the perfect presenter to help launch this new initiative, which will hopefully benefit our congregation for many years to come. So, please mark your calendars, join us, and let's learn to lead together!

### FROM RABBI BLAIR NOSANWISCH A Shavuot Story

One of the things I am most excited about growing since last Shavuot is our **Adat Shalom Chesed committee.** Members of our synagogue have been doing acts of *chesed*, loving kindness, for each other for a long time. For years this was known as Tikkun Adat, where

Charlotte Dubin and Charm Levine led myriad opportunities for Adat Shalomniks to care for one another. When I first joined Adat Shalom, we were still in the midst of the pandemic and most of Tikkun Adat's efforts had been kept up by just a few hands. Thanks to the pandemic, the amount of good we could do was limited by the number of hands involved.

Charlotte and Charm shared with me that they were looking for the next generation to take over the holy work of Tikkun Adat. Because I spend a lot of time thinking about how the clergy team can do excellent pastoral care, I wanted to see their work carried forth in a way that would allow many members to steadily do good deeds for one another, both increasing our synagogue's capacity to care, as well as increasing the opportunity to do a *mitzvah*.

My belief is that community is most powerful when we can feel the interconnections between the things we do and the people we do them with. I believe that giving to others should be institutionalized, systematized, and shared. One week we receive a challah because we just got back from the hospital, the next month we deliver a challah for someone else. One year we receive a baby basket, the next year we help deliver a baby basket for a new parent. Hebrew school children come together to help cook and freeze meals along with parents and grandparents who volunteer their time to make it happen. Aging members who are living alone get social calls from members who want to take time to do something kind.

When one of our members, Lauren Acker, shared with me that she was looking to get more involved in the synagogue, I asked if she would go on a journey with me to revitalize Tikkun Adat. She agreed to focus on creating systems that would increase the hands involved in the work of loving kindness. Since re-launching the committee, our challah baker increased the pool of bakers from 1 to 5 baker volunteers! Our pool of delivery people grew from 1 (me) to 6! Lauren and I are working together to look for the next generation of leaders to continue Charm and Charlotte's legacy for years to come, and to expand into our wildest dreams!

So what does all of this have to do with Shavuot? It was last Shavuot that I decided to take a break from the weekly challah delivery myself and start praying for a lay leader who would take this work forward and grow it to its full potential. At shavuot we traditionally eat cheesecake. One of the reasons for doing so is that dairy is associated with the divine attribute of **chesed**. Just as milk is produced and given freely to nourish a child, so too does Torah nourish and sustains us. The production of milk takes energy to be sustained, and what we have been working to create in the next chapter of Tikkun Adat is the systems and structures that will help sustain our acts of **chesed** for years and years to come. May we all merit to both provide and receive nourishment in the coming year. If you want to get involved, check out the Chesed section of our Adat Shalom website.

In March, I had the privilege to attend the Jewish Educators Assembly's 71st Annual Conference in Uniondale, New York. The theme of this year's conference - our first fully in-person event since our 2020 conference in the same location - was "Tradition, Transition, and Change." Together with colleagues from all over the country, we explored the challenges of returning to a post-pandemic world when our educational landscape has shifted so dramatically. A special thank you to the Board of Trustees and professional team for enabling me to attend professional development throughout the year. Working with my colleagues in the JEA gives me such incredible support and I am able to return to Adat Shalom strengthened and renewed after our conferences.

I am looking forward to implementing some of these explorations as we plan ahead to our 2023-2024 school year. 
Joyce Berlin Weingarten is the Woman of Distinction Honoree.

### LIGHTHOUSE-SOUTH OAKLAND: HOUSING THE HOMELESS June 25 - July 1, 2023

The clients of Lighthouse-South Oakland Shelter are currently living in apartments and will not be returning to Adat Shalom for our scheduled week. A recent census showed that Lighthouse was providing housing for over 60 men and women which included many children. In April, there were 18-20 adults with the balance being 40 children under the age of 18. Lighthouse is the only family shelter in Oakland County.

Although the program will not be based at Adat Shalom the need for meals and personal care items continues to be needed by the participants. Adat Shalom's commitment to easing the struggles of the homeless is unchanged. Our commitment is to provide lunches and dinners during our scheduled week. The program requires that the meal preparation must be done in a commercial restaurant kitchen. The cost of providing meals for over 60 people for a week will be very significant. Please consider supporting this very important program by making a contribution to the Hillel Isaac and Rachel Maisel Memorial Housing the Homeless Fund. In addition to meals, we will collect hotel sized toiletries and personal care items. Volunteers will be needed to deliver meals. 


