SOLIDARITY WITH ISRAEL

Our clergy messages and much of this edition of *The Voice* were composed before the war in Israel broke out on Simchat Torah/Shemini Atzeret. Guided by the wisdom of our tradition we offer our original composed clergy messages as part of the larger rhythm of synagogue life. In Parashat Noach after the near destruction of the entire world, God promises that "so long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night shall not cease." Everything is different now. And Synagogue life continues - because just as we have found resilience in practicing Judaism for millennia, we continue to do so today.

Here's a look back through excerpts of Rabbi Bergman's and Rabbi Nosanwisch's heartfelt outreach to us as we woke up to the horrors of that day, and the days immediately following:

October 7, 2023

Dear friends,

I normally do not send out letters on Shabbat and holidays, but today is an unprecedented situation.

Hamas began a war with Israel today and there have been numerous casualties. Today is the 50th secular anniversary of the Yom Kippur war, and Hamas caught Israel by surprise with attacks by land, air, and sea.

Israel is responding, but this will be a protracted and painful war. There is also great concern about Hezbollah and Iran. My sense is that Hamas and its allies in Lebanon and Iran are increasingly worried about Israel's warming relations with the rest of the Arab world and are looking to undermine those efforts. Instead of seeing the benefits that come from peace with Israel, they have chosen death and destruction for Israel and their own people.

This is the time to stand with Israel and its people and to put all differences aside. This is the time for us to come together as a people and pray together and support each other and remind ourselves that when we are unified, we can come through any situation.

Every day we say Psalm 30,

"Hear, O LORD, and have mercy on me;

O LORD, be my help!

You turned my lament into dancing,

you undid my sackcloth and girded me with joy,"

Let us give strength to all those in Israel, to all Jews around the world. Let us come together as a community and show the world that we are here, we are strong and that we stand for the highest values.

Pray for the peace of Jerusalem. Am Yisrael Chai.

Our brethren, the whole house of Israel, who are in distress and captivity who wander over sea and over land — may God have mercy on them, and bring them from distress to comfort, from darkness to light, from slavery to redemption, now, swiftly, and soon.

My dear beloved congregation of Adat Shalom,

Since Shabbat morning we have been taking in the news of our family in Israel. We have been feeling anguished, afraid, heart-broken, and confused. Detached and incredibly attached all at once. This is the horror and the shock of an invasion the likes of which I have never seen in my lifetime. Stories of so many innocent lives taken and incalculable loss still to come. Our friends, family, children, and children's children called up from the midst of their lives to go to war. We read the news, we check in with one another, we scan social media, looking for the language that will reinforce what we already know – something terrible is happening to our people and thus something terrible is happening to us.

For all of us who are here and not there, the emotions are raw and intense. The questions run through our heads, "What should I do?" "What can I do?" "Why am I here, safe, while they are there, fighting for their lives?" To that part of you that doesn't know what to do, I want to offer that you feel all the grief and anguish of this moment. It is your humanity speaking.

Rabbi Bergman, Hazzan Gross, Michael Wolf, Dr. Melissa Ser, Jodi Gross, Sammi Shapiro, the entire staff of Adat Shalom, and I are here for you right now. One of the few tangible things we can do is offer you whatever emotional support you need in these dark times.

Our community is here ready with suggestions of what practical things you can do for the bodies of our people – in the court of public opinion, we can hold our brethren's humanity as they must shed it in order to go to war. We can donate to the causes Rabbi Bergman shared, and to others that help you feel like you are doing something. See the information on our website for helpful information about talking to children and teens about Israel. Show up at community wide rallies in support of Israel. Come to daily minyan and pray together. Check on your friends. Cry.

And for our souls, where our most complicated feelings can co-exist, we pray to be brought from the narrow places to the open, from the dark into the light. None of us can make this journey alone. Reach out, keep reaching out, weave connection wherever you can. It is how we will survive.

FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOYCE BERLIN WEINGARTEN

As president of Adat Shalom and having served as an officer on the Executive Committee for many years, I have the honor of serving Bimah Duty on Shabbat and holidays. I have always enjoyed this privilege: being with my clergy, greeting congregants, and looking out at our devoted community who have come to services

to be together.

As we began our Torah service on Yom Kippur with Hazzan Gross holding the Torah in front of the open ark eloquently leading us in prayer, I turned to look at our congregation and became overwhelmed. You came to be with your community on the holiest day of the year, your hearts filled with prayer. Your *kavanah* was palpable, creating a collective effervescence in the room. I turned to Rabbi Bergman and said, "It really is magnificent." He agreed.

Kavanah is a Hebrew word meaning intention, direction, or purpose. It typically is referring to prayer. To pray with *kavanah* means concentrating with intention and feeling. *Kavanah* is energy that helps us be our best selves and is essential to performing mitzvot.

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel wrote, "A moral deed unwittingly done may be relevant to the world because of the aid it renders unto others. Yet a deed without devotion, for all its effects on the lives of others, will leave the life of the doer unaffected. The true goal for man is to be what he does."

In June I joined Rabbi Nosanwisch and the Green Team weeding and planting in the garden beds on the playground. We all came with the intention of doing good for the environment and the synagogue. As we worked together accomplishing our task there was a feeling of collective effervescence: energy and harmony when people share a common purpose. Watch for more opportunities to participate with our Green Team and experience the camaraderie for yourself.

Thanksgiving and Chanukah are coming: two of my favorite holidays. If you are gathering for Thanksgiving dinner take a moment before you prepare your food or eat to gather your thoughts and intentions. Preparing food with love and practicing gratitude is a powerful experience. Before saying blessings for the Chanukah, think about what this holiday of victory and freedom means to you. Enjoy how comforting and infusing to the senses the lit candles can be on these cold dark nights.

Our intentions have the ability to shape our attitudes and our daily lives. Cultivating a new direction or purpose for a routine activity elevates transformative experiences. Next time you perform a mitzvah whether it is praying, meditating, an act of kindness, or participating in one of our many opportunities at Adat Shalom, set your intentions and see what it can bring to your experience.

FROM RABBI AARON BERGMAN

Chanukah is one of the most popular Jewish holidays. Of all the different rituals in Judaism, lighting the Chanukah candles is among the most frequently performed. It is surpassed only by the Passover Seder, and maybe lighting candles on Shabbat.

Chanukah, though, unlike most other Jewish holidays, does not have its own section in the Talmud. It has only a few pages in the Tractate of Shabbat, within the larger discussion of when and how to light candles on Friday night.

This is the entire discussion of the history of Chanukah in the Talmud:

What is Hanukkah? For our Rabbis taught: On the twenty-fifth of Kislev [commence] the days of Hanukkah, which are eight on which a lamentation for the dead and fasting are forbidden. For when the Greeks entered the Temple, they defiled all the oils therein, and when the Hasmonean dynasty prevailed against and defeated them, they made search and found only one cruse of oil which lay with the seal of the High Priest, but which contained sufficient for one day's lighting only; yet a miracle was wrought therein and they lit [the lamp] therewith for eight days. The following year these [days] were appointed a Festival with [the recital of] Hallel and thanksgiving.

It seems pretty straightforward, but it begins with a question that is not asked about any other holiday. The Talmud does not ask, "What is Passover?" or "What is Purim?" What is it about Chanukah that concerned our sages so much that they had to ask this question?

To give context, the Talmud is written after the destruction of the Second Temple and the loss of all political autonomy for the Jewish people. The heroism of the Maccabees and their re-dedication of the Temple seemed like only a lost and distant past. The situation of the Jews in this time was one of subservience to the Romans.

Our sages believed that the primary reason for our downfall and loss of political power was because of corruption, religious fanaticism, and rampant nationalism. The moral character of the people plummeted, allowing the enemy to take over the land and begin an exile that lasted for two thousand years.

Our sage's question is really which Chanukah are we going to celebrate? The narrow minded and self-obsessed one that led to our downfall, or are we going to celebrate the Chanukah that focused on bringing the light and beauty and morality of our tradition to the world?

The choice we make as a people will determine our future and those of our loved ones. We must always choose light, and never the darkness. That is what Chanukah is.

FROM RABBI BLAIR NOSANWISCH

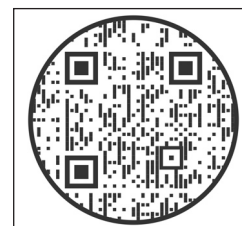
On Kol Nidre, I shared the story "If Not Higher" by Yiddish writer Y.L. Peretz, which features a skeptical Jew (a *Misnagid*) who comes to the town of the beloved Rabbi of Nemirov. The community believes that every morning in the season leading up to the Days of Awe, the Rabbi actually escapes the earthly plane and drifts up

to the heavens during his morning prayers, thus explaining his absence from shul. The skeptic sets about finding the truth of where the Rabbi goes, and he discovers that actually he's slipping into the woods in disguise to chop wood for a sick elderly Jewish woman. He does all of this in secret and in disguise so as not to embarrass her. The skeptic, once he realizes this, finds himself saying henceforth when the Chassidim of the Rabbi claim he ascends to the heavens in his prayers... "If Not Higher!"

It's a beautiful story about a true *Tzaddik*, a righteous person, who has his priorities straight and whose piety is expressed through acts of care and concern for fellow humans. As I said on Kol Nidre, our world is all the better for Tzaddikim like the Rabbi of Nemirov, but what are we to do if we find ourselves comparing our own acts of care to his?

Religion at its best should inspire in us a sense of obligation to care for one another. Religious institutions, for our part, should capture that desire and make it feasible for even regular folks (like most of us!) to do small acts of care for one another. In other words, it is the role of our religion to encourage us to CARE MORE, and it is the role of our institution to help us CARE MORE EASILY.

To that end, I want to use this article to share about Adat Shalom's Chesed Committee. Lauren Acker has worked with me to redesign our Tikkun Adat Committee into what is now the Chesed Committee since the beginning of 2022. Our mission was to make acts of loving kindness something people could easily participate in by giving to other members of Adat Shalom. Lauren created a sign-up genius (see the QR code here to visit the sign-up) making it incredibly simple for members of Adat Shalom to either bake or deliver *challot* to other members experiencing life's joys and woes. Charm Levine has been continuing Tikkun Adat's legacy by making Baby Baskets for new arrivals, and starting this November she is handing leadership over to Julie Rosenbaum, who will be chairing the baby basket initiative.



Lauren and Julie together will be kicking off a new offering of the Chesed Committee on Sunday, November 12 called Chesed Fest! This monthly Sunday morning program is open to people of all ages who wish to stop in and do good deeds. We will be braiding and baking challot, making soup and lasagnas for meal deliveries, and packing baby baskets. Our Hebrew School classes will have a chance to visit Chesed Fest with their teachers during the year. And we will have a youth professional on staff enabling parents to join in doing "grown up" tasks while their children are led in age appropriate Chesed activities. Chesed Fest will run from 10:30-12 and recur on a monthly basis through May.

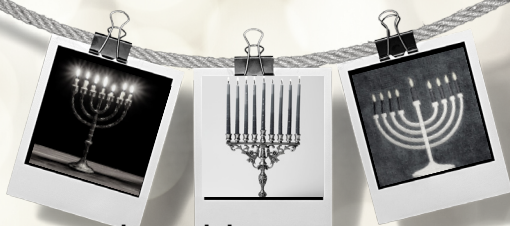

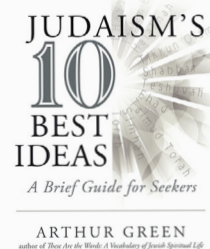

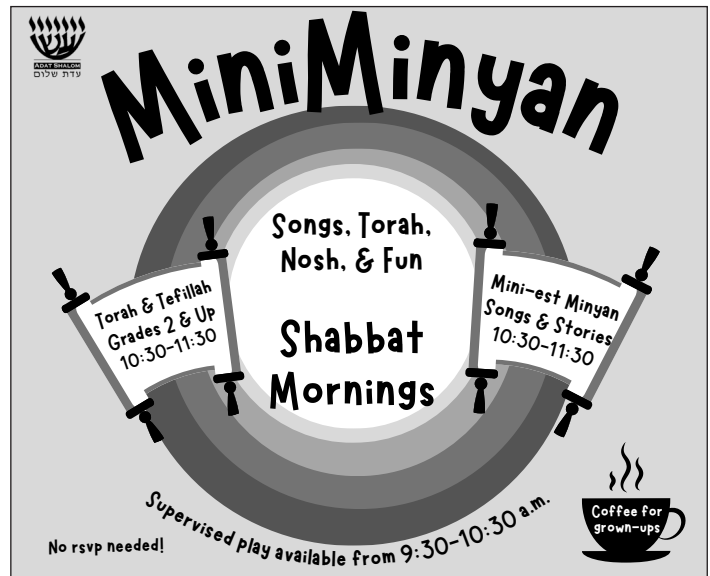
When I recently asked Madrichim what impact they hope to make this year, they shared...
