FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOYCE BERLIN WEINGARTEN

Jeffrey and I were in Washington, D.C. the morning of October 7 visiting our family when we learned of the news in Israel. I was observing Yahrzeit for my beloved mother and attended Adat Shalom Shabbat services on Zoom. Since that day the loss and pain from this crisis weighs on my mind and leaves me feeling ill at ease. It is difficult managing these complex feelings and finding ways to respond to incomprehensible and tragic events that left scars on the hearts and souls of the Jewish community.

As challenging as this time has been, it is an opportunity to bring our best selves forward. Participating with the Adat Shalom community and the Jewish community at large is an integral part of coping during these challenging times.

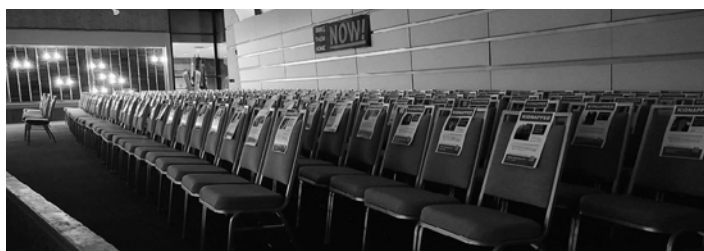
I am comforted by the sight of our congregants and the voices of our clergy. We added special prayers to our services and assembled empty chairs with the hostages' photographs in the sanctuary keeping them close to our hearts. I invite you to join your Adat Shalom community on Shabbat or at daily minyan to pray, eat together, and embrace the comfort that our Adat Shalom family can bring you.

Jewish Federation of Metro Detroit has organized solidarity events during which thousands of people found strength and comfort by attending. Many people donated funds to the Israel Emergency Campaign which raised millions of dollars locally and across the country. These funds give needed support to our sisters and brothers in Israel letting them know their community in the United States supports them and they are not alone.

Would you like to do something inspiring for the Metro Detroit community and Israel? Join us for our 10th Annual Volunteer Day on Sunday, January 14 at Adat Shalom. This event will include hands-on projects that will be given to people in need. There will be opportunities to donate items also. Bring your best self and practice Tikkun Olam as you gather with our Religious School students and other Adat Shalom members. We can lift the spirits of those receiving gifts and our own as well.

Shortly after October 7, our clergy and staff established an Israel Emergency Committee at Adat Shalom. The purpose of this committee is to reach out to our Adat Shalom family during these difficult times and continue supporting Israel. We know students of all ages have experienced antisemitism. These acts are outrageous and intolerable. We are offering assistance and guidance: you and your children are not alone. Our Adat Shalom clergy, staff, and dedicated volunteers on this committee are here to help in any way we are able.

At the end of November we saw many hostages released and reunited with their families. I pray by the time you read this they will all have been released and safe at their homes. Jeffrey and I wish you and your families a happy, healthy, and peaceful 2024.



FROM RABBI AARON BERGMAN

I love just about everything that Shel Silverstein, a nice Jewish boy from Chicago, wrote or drew. The first book of his I read was *Uncle Shelby's ABZ Book*, which my teacher mistakenly thought was similar to *Dr. Suess' ABCs*. It was not. Instead, it was a very funny and vaguely inappropriate satire of children's books. We learned quite a lot from it, much to my teacher's dismay. Our vocabulary improved enormously, though we could not use most of it.

Other books that he wrote were, *Where the Sidewalk Ends*, *Throwing Down*, and *A Light in the Attic*, all of which were delightful, whimsical, and touching. He even wrote *A Boy Named Sue*, the hit song for Johnny Cash.

There is one book of his that increasingly causes me some misgivings and mixed feelings. It is *The Giving Tree*, a book that became very popular to read around Tu B'Shvat, the New Year for trees. In some ways, it is a book about selflessness, devotion, and loyalty. In other ways, though, it is a book about giving everything to someone who does not fully appreciate it or doing things for someone and never allowing them to take responsibility and become mature on their own.

In this story, the tree gives up everything to the boy and is completely depleted and diminished by the end of the story. The boy grows into an old man, but not one who has truly lived independently or with gratitude. They have each other at the end, but I think it would have been beautiful if they could have nurtured each other and helped each other to grow in joy and strength.

On Tu B'Shvat we think about how to protect trees because they are so critical to the environment, whether for food, shade or strength of soil. We do so because they are also symbols of resilience, rootedness, and growth.

The Torah teaches us that we should give of ourselves to others, but not all of ourselves. A real relationship is where both give and both take. We are entitled to our own joy and our own meaning in life. That is why we call the Torah a tree of life, a tree that is always giving strength and guidance to us, and that allows us to grow and learn and live our own meaningful lives. The Torah helps us create communities of deep roots and soaring dreams. In return, by living our values, we make the Torah a living and eternally relevant book, keeping it as a treasure and inheritance for many generations to come.

Special Events to start off the new year

Happy New Year! I am very excited that 2024 has begun. We are looking forward to several special events taking place in the next couple of months.

A commemoration to recognize and celebrate the civil rights achievements of Martin Luther King, Jr. continues to be an important part of Adat Shalom's offerings. The first of our interfaith community programs took place in 2016 at Russell Street Missionary Baptist Church in Detroit; the event has continued annually at various local houses of worship including Adat Shalom. Flowers speak, now is the perfect opportunity — he is a gifted and one-of-a-kind preacher! Also participating in the service will be the Gospel Music Workshop of America under the direction of Dr. Michael E. Fletcher. If you've never listened to a Gospel choir in person, you have definitely been missing out! In addition to these two special participants, our own Adat Shalom choir will be singing as well as our Shabbat Rockappella musicians and singers.

On January 27 we celebrate Shabbat Shirah, the Shabbat of Song, when we read in the Torah the story of the Israelites crossing through the miraculously parted Sea of Reeds and hear the song that they triumphantly sang together. Joining me on the bimah will be both the Adat Shalom Choir and our Melodim Youth Choir.

Lastly, Lauren and I would love to invite you to celebrate with us as our children Zev and Zosia become B'nai Mitzvah on Shabbat morning, February 10. Please join us for a Kiddush luncheon following the service.

FROM RABBI BLAIR NOSANWISCH

I have shared my personal Jewish journey many times over the last few years, but I wanted to revisit it as the clergy prepare to launch our series "Synagogue Thrival Kit" this January. I grew up attending Temple Beth El, sparsely (except the year where more than 80 of my classmates had b'nai mitzvah services every weekend, sometimes multiple in a day). I learned the Alef Bet but I couldn't decipher Hebrew for the life of me. I wasn't able to translate Hebrew on the page into spoken prayers, and I certainly wasn't able to understand the meaning of what little Hebrew I could read. When I got involved in synagogue life through the Isaac Agree Downtown Synagogue in 2009, I was excited but uneducated. As I tried to join religious services, I felt powerful emotions such as shame, anger, and alienation. I remember feeling alone, while everyone else seemed effortlessly able to participate.

At the time, a friend said to me that if I looked at the whole mountain of Jewish learning I would feel overwhelmed by the insurmountable task of getting to the top, but if I took a small step towards the base of the mountain, things would go much easier for me. I thankfully took this friend's advice and began a years long process of learning a little bit at a time.

Having built a Jewish life for myself as an adult, I am aware of how difficult it can be to participate in community when we don't know the invisible rules and rituals that govern the spaces we inhabit. We might find ourselves second guessing all our instincts - is this ok to wear? Is it time to sit, or stand, or even take a break to go to the bathroom? What is everyone doing? Saying? Thinking!? And when we think we are the only ones asking these questions and everyone else KNOWS what they are doing... well... needless to say it takes enormous strength to decide to come closer rather than simply turning away and finding other places where nourishment, connection, and even spirituality seem simpler to grasp.

That being said, the benefits of belonging to a community, and a synagogue community at that, are enormous. I have seen people show up for almost-strangers with challah on a Friday, with meals for shiva, to make a minyan, to check on each other. Some come to find the sanctuary a place of refuge. Others find their place on a committee, in the parent-toddler room on a Shabbat morning, or at a social program offered for parents or empty-nesters.

All of these experiences and backgrounds will find a welcome and nourishing learning community in our Synagogue Thrival Kit cohort. By going on a Jewish journey of literacy and learning together, we hope you will get the benefit of belonging to the community and finding your place amidst millennia of Jewish wisdom. 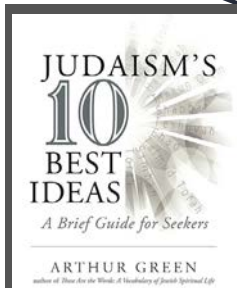

The musical RENT opens with a song called Seasons of Love, asking the audience how we measure time. How do we measure a year? Is it in minutes (525,600 to be exact)? Perhaps in cups of coffee (no, I can't count those)? Measuring time is about measuring what matters to us at any particular point in our lives.

When children are born, we count in days, then weeks, then months, and then years. We measure time in milestones: first steps, first words, first and last days of school, graduations, weddings, retirements. We measure years in birthdays and anniversaries, we count down to vacations and holidays, and our camp-going children try to race through ten months a year until they get to the start of time in their happy places. So too, we measure Jewish time in milestones - from simchat bat and brit milah to becoming b'nai mitzvah.

In the Babylonian Talmud, Rosh Hashanah, we explore a multiplicity of beginnings: Rosh Hashanah, Passover, Tu B'Shvat, the new year for tithing animals, and the start of the monarchic year are all listed. And like our ancestors in Babylonia, we measure time according to local custom, including the first day of the Gregorian year (you're probably reading this article around the first of January). In just over half a year, on June 30, I will mark my "bat mitzvah" of twelve years in this incredible community of Adat Shalom!

Supporting Israel on Tu B'Shvat

Full disclosure: my children and I love carob, straight from the tree. In Hebrew it's called *haruv*, and in Yiddish it's *bokser* (so called, by the way, from the Middle German name for the carob tree, the Bockshornbaum. Tu B'Shvat, though, is about way more than dried carob pods and almond blossoms. At its heart is the tithing of fruits and vegetables for the priests and the poor - and we can continue to support the root cause even today.

While it's challenging in Michigan to celebrate a holiday that has songs about the newest buds on almond trees, it is possible to contribute to Israel's agricultural needs even from the snowy banks of the Detroit River! I recommend Leket Israel, a non-profit food rescue program that uses volunteer support to glean and distribute healthy surplus food all around the country. Since October 7, Leket has also been purchasing and distributing cooked meals for displaced Israelis. Approximately 75% of Israel's crops are grown in the areas bordering Gaza, and other agricultural areas are in the north of the country, from which farmers and their families have been evacuated. You can find more information at leket.org.

Tu B'Shvat begins this year on the evening of **Wednesday, January 24**, and our Learning Community students will take part in an experiential program during class time.

This month we are thinking about sunnier days ahead. Tu B'Shvat begins the evening of January 24 and we start thinking about trees, harvests, and summer! I think we're at a great point of the year where we can consider what's been done, what may be dormant inside of us, and how we will grow and bloom over the next few months.

During the Tu B'Shvat seder we focus on four categories of fruits:

- Tough on the outside but soft inside (think: walnut, almond, pomegranate, coconut)
- Soft fruit with a pit inside (think: olive, date, peach, apricot)
- Soft throughout and completely edible (think: figs, grapes, raisins)
- Tough skin on the outside but sweet inside (think: mango, banana, avocado)

While you are grocery shopping, give your kids the challenge of finding one of these types of fruits either by name, picture, or description. Use your senses to describe and explore the fruit: What does it look like, taste like, smell like, feel like, sound like?

Blessing before eating fruit:

ברוך אתה ה' א-להינו מלך העולם בורא פרי העץ

Blessing for doing something new:

ברוך אתה, ה' א-להינו, מלך העולם,

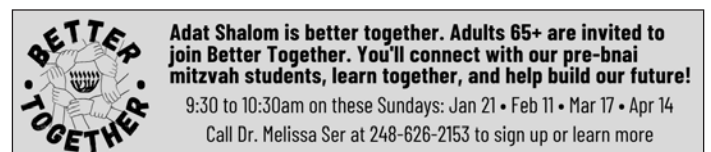

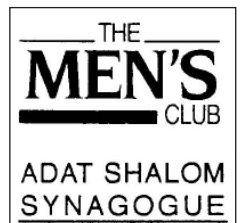

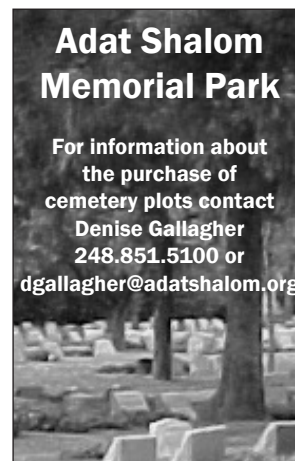
