FROM THE PRESIDENT, JOYCE BERLIN WEINGARTEN

I often think of my beloved Bubbie Fannie Whiteman, of blessed memory. She was a kind and loving woman who lived to be 102, leaving a legacy for her family and all who knew her. She was born in Horodok and immigrated to America in 1920 with her family. When I spoke at her funeral, I began by describing Bubbie's hands

and all the things she created with them her entire life.

Bubbie made strudel, blintzes, and dill pickles, beaded jewelry, and knit scarves. She lit Shabbos candles and took care of her family. She instilled her values of family, education, and Jewish tradition in her children and grandchildren. When I told her many years ago I was going to have an adult Bat Mitzvah and read from the Torah she said, "The *vimen* (translation: women) are doing it too!" She was there to celebrate with me and I was grateful for her inspiration.

My beloved father Louis Berlin, of blessed memory, was a fine man with a "shem tov," a good name. He promised his grandfather he would lay tefillin and daven Sh'ma every morning and he honored that promise his entire life. I still visualize him davening at our home. I loved sitting at services with my father as a child and an adult. This heartfelt time together inspired me to bring my children to services and have that special time with them also.

As I reflect upon my presidency at Adat Shalom, I think of what our hands have done together to make our congregation a warm, inviting community of peace. My first goal was to invite and encourage all of you to return to the building as COVID restrictions eased and enjoy being together. Collective effervescence returned to our building with your presence.

We gathered together for a magnificent evening of Comedy and Concert celebrating the B'nai Mitzvah of Rabbi Bergman and Hazzan Gross. Thanks to your Yom Kippur appeal generosity we are building an outdoor shelter and renovating our bathrooms. We renewed contracts with all our clergy and have secured endowments to enhance our synagogue.

It has been an honor and privilege to serve as your president. I thank you all for making the past two years enjoyable and rewarding for me. I have learned, laughed, and cried with you and together we have continued to make Adat Shalom the best it can be. We enhance our Adat Shalom community when we are together as a family inspiring each other to be our best selves. When I pass the gavel to Joe Wener, your next president, I know you will be in good hands. You are the heart and soul of Adat Shalom.

FROM RABBI AARON BERGMAN



During May and June we observe and celebrate so many emotional and powerful days. This is true every year, but even more so this year. As of this writing, the captives are still not home, Israel is fighting on multiple borders and antisemitism is still haunting us and challenging the very soul of the United States. It

feels natural to want to hide, to not celebrate publicly, and to just wait for things to be better before we rejoice again.

That is not the Jewish way. We mourn together. We pray together. We celebrate together. It does not matter what is going on in the world. We are together.

In May, on Yom HaZikaron, we remember and mourn all those who gave their lives for Israel. We turn our tears into joy on Yom HaAtzmaut when we celebrate 76 years of Israel being a state and three thousand years of continuous Jewish life in the Holy Land. It is difficult there now, but try to remember how difficult it was to be a Jew in the world before a State of Israel. We are far safer today in 2024 than we were in 1924 or 1824 or any time before. Antisemitism did not begin with Israel, but our ability to fight it and confront it was strengthened so much by its rise.

In June, on Shavuot, we celebrate the giving of the Torah, the moment that created us as a people, and gave us the strength, wisdom, courage, and compassion to survive and flourish to this day. We do not cancel holidays during times of danger and challenge. We celebrate them even more.

These are the words I shared at Adat Shalom last fall, marking 30 days since the hostages were taken by our enemies. I pray for their safe and speedy return. I pray we never forget who we are.

I am so deeply and profoundly grateful to be part of this extraordinary community, this beautiful and eternal people.

We are the chosen people because:

We have chosen to be a family.

We have chosen to celebrate each other's joy and feel each other's pain.

We have chosen to always remember who we are, where we are going, and how far we have come.

We have chosen to embrace life and never rejoice in anyone's death.

We have chosen to keep our promises to our ancestors and to work every day to keep our promises to the next generations of our people.

We have chosen courage over fear and faith over despair.

We have chosen to be partners with God in making a better world for everyone.

We have chosen to never forget those held captive, and those who wait for them to come safely home.

We have chosen to always stand with our people, wherever they are.

FROM HAZZAN DANIEL GROSS

Adat Shalom is proud to announce the establishment of the Kaufman Family Cantorial Chair Fund, honoring the matriarch of the family, Lillian Efros Kaufman z"l. This fund will help support music education, programs, and performances at Adat Shalom, and is a very

special honor for me as I had a close relationship with Lillian. Music was an integral part of Lillian's life, providing comfort as well as connecting her to special memories of her past, and I was privileged to share this joy with her on multiple occasions.

Lillian E. Kaufman was born in Detroit on December 1, 1924, to parents Max and Rose Efros. Growing up, Lillian enjoyed singing and participated in the choir and theater at Central High School. She passed on her love of music to her children, Alan, Steven, and Judie z"I, and the three of them sang in choirs and played piano throughout their upbringing. Lillian understood how the study and practice of an instrument taught self-discipline that would help in many other life endeavors.

Adat Shalom held a special place in Lillian's heart. She was never fond of the inequities that she experienced earlier in more traditional synagogue settings, so she loved attending the egalitarian services at Adat Shalom. Lillian would always arrive early to get her choice of seats for herself and her family. She loved the music at services and understood that the synagogue was a foundational part of the Jewish experience, not only for individuals but for families and the community as well.

Lillian also had a passion for the Yiddish language. She both spoke and taught Yiddish. The songs she enjoyed the most during our time together were those in the *mamaloshen* (literally, mother tongue). However, Lillian also had an appreciation for many kinds of music throughout her life, including classical, big band, jazz, swing, pop, rock, and rap.

Lillian had tremendous pride, but it was not hubris. Her pride was in her family and her Judaism. She was the embodiment of an *eishet chayil* – a true woman of valor. She had a *joie de vivre*, and was an exemplar of kindness, resiliency, commitment, and integrity. Never pretentious, she loved humor and laughter, and had an unparalleled moral compass. In her lifetime, Lillian was very charitable, however, she never sought recognition.

Lillian shepped naches from her family throughout her life. She was blessed with three children, three grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren. The Kaufman Family Cantorial Chair Fund is a way for Lillian's family to pay tribute to this remarkable woman, from whose memory they all now shep naches.

Lillian passed away in January of 2023. Our first concert in her memory will be this coming September. *Zichrona Livracha*. May her memory be a blessing and inspiration.

FROM RABBI BLAIR NOSANWISCH

In the wake of October 7, I have been feeling pulled between caring for my people and caring for others to an excruciating degree. The public sphere is highly polarized. In that sphere, if you are standing up for the Jewish people, you have a death wish for everyone else. Conversely, if

you are worried about the lives of other people, you must have a death wish for yourself.

For those American Jews for whom both liberalism and Zionism have been guiding values, October 7 was a cataclysm. These two orientations, one focused on civil liberties for all and the other on self-determination for us, are not actually antithetical, but we are swimming in a moral and intellectual universe in which they have been framed as oppositional. The false binary of these values does not exempt us from one for the sake of the other. Neither self-negation nor destruction of the other is in our interest or our values. When we can speak this with one voice against the pressure to choose, we will be living our spiritual purpose as a Jewish people. Zionism needs our liberalism, and liberalism needs our Zionism.

As we enter the month of May, and the Hebrew month of Iyar, we are entering the season of the Israeli national holidays, known as "the Yoms." Yom HaShoah, Yom HaZikaron, and Yom HaAtzmaut. Holocaust Memorial Day, Memorial Day for soldiers and victims of terror, and Israeli Independence Day. The architecture of these holidays is designed to reenact the transformation from degradation to redemption, from disempowerment to autonomy that are central to the Jewish story from Torah to today.

We are taught in Pirkei Avot, "if I am not for myself, who will be for me? And if I am only for myself, what am I?" This tension is captured in Israel's own declaration of independence—that the state of the Jews would also be a liberal democracy for all its citizens. As we observe the Yoms together this year, let us keep in mind that we are better Jews when we remember the stranger, and we are better liberals when we have agency and power and are willing to stand up for ourselves. Our ancestors may have hoped in '48 that we were finally exiting from the story of degradation and redemption, but what I have learned is that we will have to struggle for redemption in every generation. This year, let us weep over what has been lost on Yom HaShoah and Yom HaZikaron, and let us not only celebrate but also stand up for the essential value of democracy that we stand for on Yom HaAtzmaut.
